# SECOND ANNUAL ESSAY CONTEST FOR GOSHEN STUDENTS GRADES 7-8 and 9-12

Submission Deadline: March 21 at 5 p.m.

The Community Relations Commission (CRC) of Goshen is pleased to announce an essay contest to challenge our future leaders to rethink what it takes to build a community where every neighbor can live, work, and learn in their fullest potential.

The CRC serves Goshen by developing programs and policies that aim for a city without racism or discrimination of any kind, and building capacity for creative problem solving, resiliency, understanding and compassion among the diverse people in our community.

## **CRC Principles:**

- Honor the dignity of each person and each person's rights
- Listen to the diverse voices of the community
- Cultivate constructive communication and engagement
- Value honesty, truthfulness, and integrity
- Promote a community that is safe for all
- Acknowledge and accept the challenge of change—that it may have both positive and negative consequences
- Promote the acceptance of differences
- Promote equality and freedom from discrimination

# **Eligibility:**

All students grades 7-12 who are Goshen residents are eligible to win the competition.

# **Instructions for Essay:**

- 1) Select one of the above Principles to serve as the focus of your essay.
- 2) Your essay should answer the following:
  - a. [All students] Tell a story. Describe how the principle was present or absent in the story. Could/did the principle make the situation better?
  - b. [Sr. High] Give an example of an area where our Goshen community is experiencing a problem or is not meeting its full potential. Explain how applying or more fully applying the principle could improve our community.
- 3) Length:
  - a. For grades 7-8, 300-600 words
  - b. For grades 9-12, 500-800 words

#### **Process and Criteria of Evaluation:**

A committee of 5 representatives of the Goshen community will be reading the essays. The following criteria will guide their assessments and decisions:

- Does the essay adhere to the instructions given?
- Does the essay describe personal experiences related to the chosen principle?
- Does the essay demonstrate insight/understanding of the principle?
- Does the essay imagine how the principle can be applied to better serve Goshen's needs?
- Does the essay demonstrate imagination, insight, clarity, cohesion, and relevance?

#### Awards:

First, Second, and Third prizes will be awarded in each of the two different grade groups.

1<sup>st</sup> Prize: \$150 2<sup>nd</sup> Prize: \$100 3<sup>rd</sup> Prize: \$50
