## GOSHEN COMMON COUNCIL

### Minutes of the AUGUST 7, 2023 Regular Meeting

*Convened in the Council Chambers, Police & Court Building, 111 East Jefferson Street, Goshen, Indiana*

**Mayor Gina M. Leichthy called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.**

Afterward, the **Mayor** said her grandson led the Pledge of Allegiance that at her inauguration. She announced that she would welcome other young people leading the Pledge at Council meetings. She invited parents to contact her office if they knew of a child who would like to lead the Pledge at a Council meeting.

**Mayor Leichthy asked the Clerk-Treasurer to conduct the roll call.**

#### Approval of Minutes:

**Mayor Leichthy** asked the Council's wishes regarding the **minutes of the July 17, 2023 Regular Meeting.**

**Councilor Nisley** made a motion to accept the **July 17, 2023 minutes as presented.** **Councilor Pérez** seconded the motion. The motion passed 7-0 on a voice vote.

#### Approval of Meeting Agenda:

**Mayor Leichthy** presented the agenda as submitted by the Clerk-Treasurer. **Councilor King** moved to approve the agenda. **Councilor Eichorn** seconded the motion. The motion passed 7-0 on a voice vote.

#### Privilege of the Floor:

At 6:03 p.m., **Mayor Leichthy** invited public comments on matters not on the agenda. There were none.

#### 1) Environmental Resilience presentation: AmeriCorps, a Year of Service in Goshen

**Aaron Sawatsky Kingsley, Director of the City Department of Environmental Resilience,** said tonight there would be sharing about the work of the City's two AmeriCorps Service members, **Acadia Imhoff** and **Shae Medlen.** **Kingsley** said AmeriCorps is the domestic version of the Peace Corps that provides communities with service members to take on projects that address unmet needs in communities. The Michiana Council of Governments (MACOG) contacted City staff last summer and asked if there was interest in having AmeriCorps service members provide support and service. The City was interested and pursued member placements.

**Kingsley** said service members provide 300 to 1,700 hours of service per year to communities. He said Goshen's volunteers provided the equivalent of 1½ full-time positions, or 2,600 hours to the City at a cost of \$17,000 with the remainder of their salaries paid by grants.

For the City, **Kingsley** said the service members worked on the Goshen Community Orchard and active transportation, in particular increasing bicycle awareness. While the service members could have pursued full-time jobs, **Kingsley** said they chose to help the City.



Because they did such good work, **Kingsley said the Department of Environmental Resilience is planning to have four AmeriCorps Service members in the coming year.** Kingsley then welcomed two member presentations.

**Acadia Imhoff provided the following information:**

- She grew up in Eastern Pennsylvania, was home schooled, earned an associate degree in Environmental Studies from Northampton Community College in 2020 and a bachelor degree in Sustainability studies from Goshen College in 2022.
- The Goshen Community Orchard was established in 2019, but had not been fully developed because of the COVID-19 pandemic and staff issues.
- As of November 2022, the orchard had 85 total plants and more than 25 varieties, but deer and other creatures were eating the plants. So, Imhoff's job was to more fully establish the orchard. Today, the orchard has more than 250 plants and upwards of 50 varieties, some of which are less common.
- The orchard supports the City's Climate Action Plan by adding to the tree canopy, improving City-owned property, applying appropriate tree maintenance practices and improving landscape maintenance policies.
- To carry out orchard inventory and planting, Imhoff conducted an assessment of existing plants, conducted organization and mapping, did species research, purchased plants and maintained an inventory. She also attended workshops.
- To improve the orchard's infrastructure, Imhoff constructed a fence to keep out deer, helped install permanent signage and arranged for a shed to store tools.
- Imhoff maintained the orchard, which included spring pruning and planting, soil improvements, weeding, mulching and watering.
- She also promoted education about the orchard by building public awareness, creating fliers and informational signs, informing people about it during the Arbor Day celebration and engaging in community conversations.
- Imhoff said the goals of the orchard are to create a community space that fosters relationships, add to ecosystem diversity, address local food insecurity, promote life learning and create a volunteer network.

**Shae Medlen provided the following information:**

- She grew up in Middlebury, earned an Associate of Applied Science in Business Administration in 2017 and a Bachelor of Science in Environmental Policy and Management in 2022.
- Her work for the City focused on active transportation, with an emphasis on bicycling. This included supporting Bicycle Friendly America applications, events and public education and trail surveying and GIS.
- Promoting bicycle usage supports the City's Climate Action Plan by creating a more sustainable transportation system and infrastructure, eliminating barriers to employees bicycling to work, providing "fleet" bikes at appropriate City buildings to reduce miles driven using motorized vehicles and continuing to work to achieve the goals of Goshen's Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan.
- Medlen promoted the goals of Bicycle Friendly America and helped businesses file for applications to the program and also promoted cycling, engaged in public education and collaborated with local businesses.
- She has a member of an active transportation committee and conducted extensive research on bicycle parking infrastructure needs to help further the City's plans.



- Medlen worked on the City's Bicycle Friendly America application and also assisted businesses.
- To encourage more bicycle usage, Medlen assisted at three 2023 events. The E-Bike Try-Athlon, on May 3, was held to encourage City employees to test ride E-bikes, and 33 did so. This led to the purchase of more E-bikes for City employee usage. The First Friday Bike Valet, on May 5, included bike parking and 29 free safety checks and minor bike tune-ups from Lincoln Avenue Cycling.
- The Goshen Women's Ride, on May 21, was aimed at increasing bicycle usage by women; less than 30% of U.S. cyclists are women. The ride, which included a historical tour and actors portraying famous Goshen women, attracted 55 participants.
- Medlen also mapped the Larry Beachy Classified Forest, surveying more than 20 miles of trails, and collected data on cycling. Her research showed that on average, 300 cyclists use the Pumpkinvine Vine Trail, along Abshire Park, daily and 200 cyclists use the Millrace Trail daily.

**Goshen's Service members** also supported each other, participated in AmeriCorps Service Week, AmeriCorps National Service Training Indiana Arborist Association Conference, and helped with forestry projects. They also helped City staff create environmentally-safe ornaments for a "mirth" Christmas tree, produced a monthly informational flier for City employees and planted native flowers in a small stormwater basin.

Kingsley invited questions from Councilors. **In response to Councilor questions, Kingsley, Imhoff and Medlen provided the following information.**

- The Goshen Community Orchard is located at Abshire Park, east of the cabin.
- Fencing to keep deer out of the orchard appears to be working.
- Progress is being made by the City and businesses to increase cycling.
- Next year's AmeriCorps volunteers will work on the community orchard, help develop a food forest, help the Engineering and Utilities departments work on the lead and copper pipe survey, conduct stormwater work and eco-system management. In the coming years, there may be work on the City's Sensory Trail.
- City staff have not given presentations to local colleges about AmeriCorps, but could do so.
- The Environmental Resilience Department has budgeted for the cost of the AmeriCorps volunteers.

**Councilor Eichorn** endorsed AmeriCorps, adding that she was a service member in Florida.

**To thank Imhoff and Medlin for their work, Kingsley gave each a small tree and some gift certificates.**

**Councilors and the Mayor thanked the service members for their work for the City. The audience responded with applause.**

At 6:35 p.m., **Pamela Weishaupt of Goshen** addressed the Council. She asked why the City was putting so much effort into these environmental projects when it just sprayed a toxic chemical along the Millrace.

**Kingsley** said **Weishaupt** was referring to the spraying of chemicals along the Millrace about three weeks ago. He said he checked with City Parks and Recreation Department staff and learned that because of a mistake, a chemical was sprayed that killed weeds. He said the mistake was acknowledged and will not be repeated.

**Councilor King** said she appreciated the explanation and had intended to raise the issue. In response to questions from **Councilor Nisley**, **Kingsley** said an herbicide was used and he can research the exact one and report back.



## **2) Ordinance 5162: An Amendment to Goshen Zoning Ordinance 3011**

Mayor Leichty called for the introduction of Ordinance 5162, *An Amendment to Goshen Zoning Ordinance 3011* on First Reading. Council President Weddell asked the Clerk-Treasurer to read Ordinance 5162 by title only, which was done.

**Weddell/Nisley moved to approve Ordinance 5162 on First Reading.**

### **BACKGROUND:**

**Ordinance 5162, which was before the Common Council for approval, would authorize changes to the Goshen Zoning Ordinance.**

In an Aug. 7, 2023 memorandum to the Common Council, **City Planning & Zoning Administrator Rhonda Yoder** wrote that the Goshen Plan Commission met on July 18, 2023, in regular session and considered a request for a text amendment to the Goshen Zoning Ordinance, Ordinance 3011, to make routine corrections and edits, including to:

- Delete swallowtail streamers as a sign type
- Update the tourist home definition and allow as a permitted use rather than a conditional use
- Delete the minimum building size in the R-4 District per recent State law change
- Update the B-4 District to allow outside display as in B-3 District
- Add an allowance for awning valance lettering
- Allow up to 75% of sign area for an electronic message center (EMC) signs
- Allow administrative review for bufferyard landscaping changes when utilities or utility easements are present
- Update the conditional use section to delete all PUD District references and to generally exclude fences as a structure that requires an increased setback
- Remove drive-in establishment as a conditional use in B-2 District
- Add a fee for a request to modify commitment
- Delete PUD and Historic District columns from Table of Permitted Uses
- Add two uses to the Table of Permitted Uses that are currently in Table of Parking Requirements only
- Allow business offices in M-1 and M-2 Districts
- And to add corporate offices as a new use, conditional in the B-1 District and permitted in B-2, B-3, B-4, M-1 and M-2 Districts.

**Yoder** wrote that the Plan Commission received no public comments or questions from the public and forwarded the proposed zoning changes to the Goshen Common Council with a favorable recommendation, by a vote of 6-0.

**Yoder** summarized the proposed changes in a detailed memo and showed them in an attached red-lined document.

### **AUGUST 7, 2023 COUNCIL DISCUSSION AND APPROVAL OF ORDINANCE 5162:**

**Mayor Leichty** invited a staff presentation on Ordinance 5162.

**City Planning & Zoning Administrator Rhonda Yoder** provided an overview of Ordinance 5162; which she noted was before the Common Council for approval on First Reading. She explained the procedure for the zoning changes coming before the Council and provided a highlight of the some of the most significant changes.

**Mayor Leichty** invited Councilor questions.

**In response to questions and comments from Councilors Pérez, Schrock, Riegsecker and Nisley, Yoder provided the following information:**



- The PUD district isn't being deleted. A reference in the ordinance is being removed in a section dealing with conditional uses, which is an administrative review and doesn't require a variance or a public hearing. So, it didn't make sense for them to be referenced as a separate district for conditional uses.
- In the downtown area, electronic message center signs are allowed outside of the core historic district. This change will increase the display area from 50 percent to 75 percent of a sign area. However, there will be no change in where such signs are permitted.
- The City is not allowed to regulate short-term rentals, which are sometimes known as Airbnb's. The state statute has certain requirements that must be met, such as being listed on a platform like Airbnb, and must meet other requirements. But if they meet those requirements, they are short term rentals which cannot be regulated by the City.
- The state Legislative Assembly passed legislation that no longer allows communities to regulate the size of mobile homes, so that provision should be removed.

**Councilor Riegsecker** said he reviewed and liked the zoning changes, which seemed to indicate a less restrictive approach while still giving the City appropriate authority.

**Yoder** said the City will not be changing the intent of the zoning ordinance, but is addressing changes that should be made in language that didn't work as intended.

**Councilor Nisley** encouraged **Yoder** to continue looking for ways to adjust the ordinance as needed.

**Yoder** said there is an annual review to make changes mandated by the state or to make changes recommended by City staff.

**There were no other questions or comments from Councilors, so at 6:50 p.m., Mayor Leichty invited public comments on Ordinance 5162. There were none.**

**There were no further Council comments or questions. Councilors also indicated that they were ready to vote.**

**On a voice vote, Councilors unanimously approved Ordinance 5162, An Amendment to Goshen Zoning Ordinance 3011 on First Reading, by a 7-0 margin, with all Councilors present voting "yes" at 6:51 p.m.**

**Councilors gave unanimous consent to the Mayor to proceed with the Second Reading of Ordinance 5162.**

**Mayor Leichty called for the introduction, on Second Reading, of Ordinance 5162, An Amendment to Goshen Zoning Ordinance 3011, Council President Weddell asked the Clerk-Treasurer to read Ordinance 5162 by title only, which was done.**

**Weddell/Pérez moved for passage of Ordinance 5162 on Second and Final Reading.**

**Mayor Leichty invited further questions or comments from Councilors or the public.**

**Glenn Null of Goshen** said the revised ordinance stated that school buildings had to be a minimum of 50 feet from all property lines. He said this didn't seem to be the case in West Goshen. He asked if some existing buildings were "grandfathered in" (allowed). **Yoder** said "grandfathered" usually refers to "legal non-conforming" uses, but also could be uses allowed because a variance had been granted or to structures built before there was a zoning ordinance.



**Null** said he just wanted to point out that some buildings were constructed before zoning regulations and this should be considered before any City enforcement.

**Councilor Pérez** asked how the zoning changes were communicated to the public.

**Yoder** said the changes were advertised before the Plan Commission meeting and a public hearing was held at the commission meeting, at which no one spoke. The changes were also included on the Common Council agenda and in the meeting packet. She also noted that the provision **Null** mentioned was not new; the only change was excluding fences from the setback requirement.

**Mayor Leichty** said there was also public notification of the Council meeting.

**Councilor King** said there didn't seem to be any significant changes. She said she usually advocates for a second Council meeting to review proposed zoning changes, and to give more time for the public to comment, if there are significant modifications. But she said that didn't seem to be the case this time.

**Council President Weddell** also noted there were public safeguards for the proposed changes.

**There were no further comments. Councilors also indicated they were ready to vote.**

**On a voice vote, Councilors approved Ordinance 5162, An Amendment to Goshen Zoning Ordinance 3011, on Second and Final Reading, by a 7-0 margin, with all Councilors present voting "yes" at 6:57 p.m.**

### **3) Resolution 2023-16 – Category Transfer (for the Legal Department)**

**Mayor Leichty** called for the introduction of Resolution 2023-16, *Category Transfer*. **Council President Weddell** asked the Clerk-Treasurer to read Resolution 2023-16 by title only, which was done.

**Weddell/Eichorn moved to approve Resolution 2023-16.**

#### **BACKGROUND:**

**Resolution 2023-16**, would request authorization from the Council and Mayor to move available resources between major categories within City Legal Department funds. The Legal Department requested a category transfer to fund services provided by Barks, Kolbus, Rife & Schuler, LLP under an amended agreement for attorney services.

The Mayor and Clerk-Treasurer requested this resolution because the Common Council is the City's fiscal body which authorizes the City's budget and any budget adjustments.

In a memorandum to the Council, **Clerk-Treasurer Richard R. Aguirre** wrote that an appropriation is "permission to spend available money" and is tied to a specific fund. Within a fund there are four spending categories and multiple accounts. The state Department of Local Government Finance ("DLGF") requires Council approval to move an appropriation from one category to another. The Council can approve this when a City department needs additional room to spend in one category and has available appropriations in another category.

**Aguirre** wrote that by moving an appropriation from one category to another, the Council is only changing the category from which the City pays an expenditure. The Council is not approving any additional spending, so the fund's total appropriation remains the same.



**Aguirre** wrote that for the proposed category transfer in Resolution 2022-16, **City Attorney Bodie Stegelmann** recognized a need in one of his budget categories, reported the need to the Mayor and Clerk-Treasurer, and requested that the Council approve the transfer to continue their operations. More specifically, the Legal Department requested a category transfer to fund services provided by Barkses, Kolbus, Rife & Schuler, LLP under an amended agreement for attorney services.

**If approved, \$30,000 would be transferred from: Budget Category: Personnel (Legal/Full-time Personnel, line #101-510-05-411.0130) to Budget Category: Other Services & Charges (Legal/Professional services, line #101-510-05-431.0000).**

**Aguirre** also wrote that if the Council approved this proposed category transfer, the Clerk-Treasurer would then register the adjustment in the City's books and communicate the transfer to the department when completed. This category transfer is an adjustment that only requires Council approval to be final, and does not require notification to the state Department of Local Government Finance.

#### **AUGUST 7, 2023 COUNCIL DISCUSSION AND APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION 2023-16:**

**Mayor Leichthy** asked if **Councilors** had any questions or comments about **Resolution 2023-16**.

**Councilor Schrock** asked what the payment would be for.

**City Attorney Bodie Stegelmann** said a full-time employee who worked as Assistant City Attorney left earlier this year. The open job was advertised, but Stegelmann said he made a decision to contract for attorney services for the work for the rest of 2023. He said **Don Shuler** of Barkses, Kolbus, Rife & Schuler, LLP will be working 20 hours per week for the City Legal Department. Stegelmann said funds are being transferred from full-time personnel to professional services. And in 2024, he said the plan is for Shuler to become a part-time City employee.

**Council President Weddell** joked that as **Deputy Clerk-Treasurer Jeffery Weaver** would explain, money is just being moved from one Department folder to another folder in the same funds box.

**There were no additional Council comments, so at 6:58 p.m., Mayor Leichthy invited public comments on Resolution 2023-16. There were none.**

**Council President Weddell indicated that Councilors were ready to vote.**

**On a voice vote, Councilors approved Resolution 2023-16, Category Transfer, by a 7-0 margin, with all Councilors present voting "yes" at 6:59 p.m.**

#### **Elected Official Reports:**

**Councilor Schrock** informed Councilors that this Saturday is the annual **East Goshen Neighborhood Association Hillbilly Hot Dog Sale**. Hot dogs can be picked up starting at 10 a.m. at 1210 East Lincoln Avenue (Cycle Works of Goshen). He said proceeds will benefit the association.

**Councilor Eichorn** said the **City Community Relations Commission will meet Aug. 8.**



**Council President Weddell** said the **City Redevelopment Commission** also will meet **Aug. 8**.

**Councilor Schrock** said the **Wilden Avenue road project** is looking great. He said the local anticipation for the completion of the project is “huge.” He thanked **City Director of Public Works & Utilities Dustin Sailor** and his team for their work and said it will be great when the project is completed.

There were no further comments by elected officials.

**Adjournment:**

**Councilor Nisley** made a motion to adjourn the meeting. **Councilor Pérez** seconded the motion. **Councilors** unanimously approved the motion to adjourn the meeting.

**Mayor Leichty** adjourned the meeting at 7:01 p.m.

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## MEMORANDUM

The Goshen Plan Commission met on August 15, 2023, in regular session and considered a request for a rezoning from Residential R-2 District to Commercial B-3 District for property generally located on the west side of High Street, immediately south and adjacent to the parcel on the southwest corner of High Street and Pike Street, with the following outcome:

*Forwarded to the Goshen Common Council with a favorable recommendation by a vote of 6-0.*

*The recommendation is based on the following:*

1. The rezoning is consistent with the existing zoning and land use in the Pike Street B-3 District corridor.
2. The requirements of the B-3 District are able to be met if the parcel is included with existing B-3 parcels to the north.

Prior to the Plan Commission meeting the Planning office received the following inquiries:

- Three email inquiries asking what use is proposed for the overall site.

At the Plan Commission meeting, no comments/questions were received.

Ordinance 5163

Amend Ordinance 3011 by Rezoning Real Estate Hereinafter Described from Residential R-2 District to Commercial B-3 District

WHEREAS PRIMECO, Inc., Aby Mohamed of Aby Groups, and Woolpert submitted an application on the 26th day of July 2023 to rezone the real estate hereinafter described from Residential R-2 District to Commercial B-3 District, and the Goshen City Plan Commission did after proper legal notice conduct a hearing on said Petition as provided by the Law on the 15th day of August 2023, and recommended the adoption of this Ordinance by a vote of 6-0.

NOW, THEREFORE be it ordained by the Common Council of the City of Goshen, Indiana, that:

Property generally located on the west side of High Street, immediately south and adjacent to the parcel on the southwest corner of High Street and Pike Street, with no common address, and more particularly described as follows:

Lot Numbered Ten (10) in WEST VIEW ADDITION to the City of Goshen, including the South Half of the vacated alley adjacent to and North of the above described Lot.

All of the above shall be rezoned from Residential R-2 District to Commercial B-3 District, and the zone maps designated and referred to in Ordinance No. 3011 shall hereby be amended and ordered amended to reflect such classification and rezoning of said real estate.

### **ANALYSIS**

PRIMECO, Inc., Aby Mohamed of Aby Groups, and Woolpert request a rezoning from Residential R-2 District to Commercial B-3 District for property to be redeveloped with 1102, 1106 and 1110 W Pike Street. The subject property is ±0.19 acres, generally located on the west side of High Street, immediately south and adjacent to the parcel on the southwest corner of High Street and Pike Street, with no common address, described as Lot Numbered Ten (10) in West View Addition to the City of Goshen, including the south half of the vacated alley adjacent to and north of the described lot.

The subject property is a single tax parcel on the west side of High Street, immediately south of 1102 W Pike Street. The property appears to have no common address, and is vacant except for a small garage structure.

If the rezoning to Commercial B-3 is approved, the developer intends to include the High Street parcel with 1102, 1106 and 1110 W Pike Street to be developed as one zoning lot with a restaurant. The properties at 1102, 1106 and 1110 W Pike Street are already zoned B-3, so they are not part of the rezoning petition. The High Street parcel will likely be used primarily for stormwater drainage.

The B-3 District requires increased side and rear setbacks abutting residential zoning, and the B-3 District adjacent to residential land use requires landscaping screening per the Zoning Ordinance partial landscaping formula.

The rezoning petition is not subject to site plan review, but a preliminary site plan has been provided and is included for informational purposes only. Site plan review will occur through the City's Technical Review process. Based on the preliminary site plan, developmental variances will be required for the overall site, but the High Street parcel appears able to meet the increased residential setbacks and landscaping screening.


The B-3 District corridor along Pike Street, from Chicago Avenue west to the north/south alley east of Riverside Blvd, was first established in July 1992, and is shown on the enclosed Zoning Map. Prior to 1992, the corridor had been mostly B-1 District (neighborhood commercial).

Inclusion of the High Street parcel in the B-3 District corridor is consistent with the existing zoning and land use in the corridor, and the requirements of the B-3 District are able to be met if the parcel is included with existing B-3 parcels to the north.

### **RECOMMENDATION**

Staff recommends the Plan Commission forward a favorable recommendation to Goshen Common Council for the rezoning from Residential R-2 District to Commercial B-3 District for property generally located on the west side of High Street, immediately south and adjacent to the parcel on the southwest corner of High Street and Pike Street, based upon the following:


1. The rezoning is consistent with the existing zoning and land use in the Pike Street B-3 District corridor.
2. The requirements of the B-3 District are able to be met if the parcel is included with existing B-3 parcels to the north.





DATE: August 28, 2023

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Ordinance 5161 is being presented to the City Council for the second reading. A copy of the ordinance, along with all of the draft financing documents as exhibits, is included. This ordinance authorizes the City's issuance of a taxable Economic Development Revenue bond specifically for the Ariel Cycleworks Apartment Project and the issued bonds will be purchased by the developer, or their bank, to fund infrastructure components for their project.

An Economic Development Commission (EDC) meeting was held on Friday, August 18<sup>th</sup>, and a favorable Project Report has been forwarded to the Goshen Plan Commission. The issuance of this bond and all the terms associated with it are in line with the Development Agreement that was approved by the Goshen Redevelopment Commission, City Council and Board of Works & Safety last summer, including the agreement to provide 100% TIF reimbursement for 25 years.

ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF GOSHEN, INDIANA TO ISSUE ITS "[TAXABLE] ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2023 (ARIEL PROJECT)" AND APPROVING OTHER ACTIONS IN RESPECT THERETO

WHEREAS, the Goshen Economic Development Commission ("Commission") conducted a public hearing and adopted a resolution, which resolution has been transmitted hereto, finding that the financing of certain economic development facilities of AP Cycleworks LLC ("Company") complies with the purposes and provisions of IC 36-7-11.9 and -12 ("Act") and that such financing will be of benefit to the health and welfare of the City of Goshen, Indiana ("City" or "Issuer") and its citizens;

WHEREAS, the Goshen Redevelopment Commission ("Redevelopment Commission") has determined to pledge TIF Revenues collected in the 9<sup>th</sup> Street Corridor Allocation Area (each as defined in the hereinafter defined Financing Documents) to be used to pay debt service on the Bonds pursuant to a Financing and Covenant Agreement between the Company and the City, dated as of the first day of the month the Bonds are sold or issued ("Financing Agreement"). The City shall issue its [Taxable] Economic Development Revenue Bonds, Series 2023 (Ariel Project) ("Bonds"), pursuant to this ordinance to finance the construction of infrastructure improvements, including but not limited to, water, sewer, stormwater, electric and road improvements, including sidewalks, demolition, and the construction of footers and slabs associated with multi-family residential units assessed as commercial property, together with all necessary appurtenances and related improvements as further set forth in Exhibit B to Amending Declaratory Resolution No. 02-2012 (as amended to date)(collectively, "Project") needed to serve the multi-family residential development ("Facility") to be constructed by the Company, in

or physically connected to the 9<sup>th</sup> Street Corridor Allocation Area and costs of issuance and related expenses; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has heretofore approved and recommended the adoption of this form of ordinance by this Common Council, has considered the issue of adverse competitive effect and has approved the forms of and has transmitted for approval by the Common Council the Financing Agreement; the Trust Indenture (including form of Bonds) between the Issuer and a financial institution chosen by the Issuer, as trustee, dated as of the first day of the month the Bonds are sold or issued ("Indenture"); and the Bond Purchase Agreement between the Issuer and the purchaser of the Bonds (collectively, "Financing Documents");

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GOSHEN, INDIANA, THAT:

Section 1. It is hereby found that: (i) the financing of the economic development facilities, including the Project to serve the Facility, in or physically connected to the 9<sup>th</sup> Street Corridor Allocation Area referred to in the Financing Documents approved by the Commission and presented to this Common Council; (ii) the issuance and sale of the City's [Taxable] Economic Development Revenue Bonds, Series 2023 (Ariel Project) ("Bonds"); (iii) utilizing the proceeds of the Bonds for the construction of the Project to serve the Facility; (iv) the payment of the Bonds from TIF Revenues collected in the 9<sup>th</sup> Street Corridor Allocation Area; and (v) the securing of the Bonds under the Trust Indenture, complies with the purposes and provisions of IC 36-7-11.9 and -12 and will be of benefit to the health and welfare of the City and its citizens. The proceeds of the Bonds will be used for the financing of the construction of the Project to serve the Facility and the costs of issuance of the Bonds. The Common Council further finds, determines, ratifies and confirms that the promotion of economic development, creation of new

job opportunities and multi-family housing to assist in alleviating the housing shortage in the City and increased investment in the City, is desirable to preserve the health, safety and general welfare of the citizens of the City; and that it is in the public interest that the Commission and the Issuer to take such action as they lawfully may to encourage economic development, creation of job opportunities, creation of multi-family housing and increased investment in the City.

Section 2. At the public hearing held before the Commission, the Commission considered whether the funding of the Projects and the construction of the Facility would have an adverse competitive effect on any similar facilities located in or near the City, and subsequently found, based on findings of fact set forth in its resolution transmitted hereto ("Resolution") and the absence of evidence from the public or a competitor of substantive probative value, that the funding of the Project and the construction of the Facility would not have an adverse competitive effect. This Common Council hereby confirms the findings on adverse competitive effect set forth in the Commission's Resolution, and hereby finds that the construction of the Projects to serve the Facility and the construction of the Facility will be of benefit to the health and welfare of the citizens of the City.

Section 3. The substantially final forms of the Financing Agreement, the Bond Purchase Agreement and the Indenture approved by the Commission are hereby approved (herein collectively referred to as the "Financing Documents" referred to in IC 36-7-11.9 and -12), and the Financing Documents are attached hereto as Exhibit A. In accordance with the provisions of IC 36-1-5-4, two (2) copies of the Financing Documents are on file in the office of the Clerk-Treasurer for public inspection.

Section 4. The City may issue its Bonds, maturing no later than twenty-five (25) years after the date of issuance, in the aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$6,250,000. The

Bonds are to be issued for the purpose of procuring funds to pay the costs of construction of the Project to serve the Facility, all as more particularly set out in the Indenture and the Financing Agreement, which Bonds will be payable as to principal and interest from TIF Revenues collected in the 9<sup>th</sup> Street Corridor Allocation Area pursuant to the Financing Documents or as otherwise provided in the above-described Indenture. The Bonds shall be issued in fully registered form in denominations of \$1,000 and integral multiples thereof or as provided in the above-described Indenture, payable semiannually on January 1 and July 1, beginning no earlier than January 1, 2024. Payments on the Bonds are payable in lawful money of the United States of America by check mailed or delivered to the registered owners or by wire transfer as provided in the Indenture. The Bonds shall never constitute a general obligation of, an indebtedness of, or a charge against the general credit of the City as described in the Indenture nor are the Bonds payable in any manner from revenues raised by taxation except for TIF Revenues collected in the 9<sup>th</sup> Street Corridor Allocation Area.

Section 5. The Mayor and the Clerk-Treasurer are authorized and directed to sell the Bonds to the Company, or its designee, at a price of not less than the par value thereof. The Bonds shall bear interest as a rate not to exceed 6.00% per annum.

Section 6. The Bonds may be both purchased by the bond purchaser in installments and drawn down by the Company in installments (subject to the Internal Revenue Code).

Section 7. The Mayor and the Clerk-Treasurer are authorized and directed to execute and attest, manually or electronically, and to affix or imprint by any means the City seal to, the documents constituting the Financing Documents approved herein on behalf of the City and any other document which may be necessary or desirable prior to, on or after the date hereof to consummate or facilitate the transaction, including the Bonds authorized herein. The Mayor and

the Clerk-Treasurer are hereby expressly authorized to approve any modifications or additions to the documents constituting the Financing Documents which take place after the date of this ordinance with the review and advice of counsel to the City; it being the express understanding of this Common Council that the Financing Documents are in substantially final form as of the date of this ordinance. The approval of these modifications or additions shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution and attestation thereof and the affixing of the seal thereto or the imprinting of the seal thereon; provided, however, that no such modification or addition shall change the terms and conditions set forth in IC 36-7-12-27(a)1-10, including the maximum principal amount of, interest rate on or term of the Bonds as approved by the Common Council by this ordinance without further consideration by the Common Council. The signatures of the Mayor and the Clerk-Treasurer on the Bonds may be either manual or facsimile signatures. The use of electronic signatures by the Mayor and the Clerk-Treasurer are authorized and affirmed with full valid legal effect and enforceability. The Clerk-Treasurer is authorized to arrange for delivery of such Bonds to a financial institution chosen by the Issuer ("Trustee"), and payment for the Bonds will be made to the Trustee and after such payment, the Bonds will be delivered by the Trustee to the purchaser thereof. The Bonds shall be originally dated the date of issuance and delivery thereof.

Section 8. The provisions of this ordinance and the Indenture securing the Bonds shall constitute a contract binding between the City and the holders of the Bonds, and after the issuance of the Bonds, this ordinance shall not be repealed or amended in any respect which would adversely affect the rights of such holders so long as the Bonds or the interest thereon remains unpaid.

Section 9. This ordinance shall constitute "official action" for purposes of compliance with state laws requiring governmental action as authorization for future reimbursement from the proceeds of bonds.

Section 10. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage.

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## TRUST INDENTURE

This TRUST INDENTURE dated as of the first day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2023, by and between the CITY OF GOSHEN, INDIANA ("Issuer"), a municipal corporation and political subdivision duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Indiana and \_\_\_\_\_, a national banking association duly organized and existing under the laws of the United States of America, with a designated corporate trust office located in the City of [Indianapolis, Indiana] [\_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_], as Trustee ("Trustee");

### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Indiana Code, Title 36, Article 7, Chapters 11.9, -12, -14 and -25 (collectively, "Act"), authorize and empower the Issuer to issue revenue bonds and to provide the proceeds therefrom for the purpose of financing economic development facilities and vests such Issuer with powers that may be necessary to enable it to accomplish such purposes; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of the Act, the Issuer has determined to proceed with the financing of all or a portion of the construction of infrastructure improvements, including but not limited to, water, sewer, stormwater, electric and road improvements, including sidewalks, demolition, and the construction of footers and slabs associated with multi-family residential units assessed as commercial property, together with all necessary appurtenances and related improvements as further set forth in Exhibit B to Amending Declaratory Resolution No. \_\_\_\_\_ (collectively, "Projects"), to induce AP Cycleworks LLC ("Company") to construct the hereinafter defined Facility, in or physically connected to the Consolidated River Race/US 33 Economic Development Area ("Area") and the 9<sup>th</sup> Street Corridor Allocation Area and to pay costs of issuance of the Bonds by offering to issue its [Taxable] Economic Development Revenue Bonds, Series 2023 (Ariel Project) in the principal amount of \$\_\_\_\_\_ ("Series 2023 Bonds"), pursuant to this Trust Indenture and to use the proceeds thereof pursuant to the Financing and Covenant Agreement, dated as of \_\_\_\_\_ 1, 2023, between the Issuer and the Company ("Financing Agreement") for the purpose of paying certain costs of the Projects and issuance expenses; and

WHEREAS, the execution and delivery of this Indenture and the issuance of revenue bonds under the Act as herein provided have been in all respects duly and validly authorized by proceedings duly passed on and approved by the Issuer; and

WHEREAS, after giving notice in accordance with the Act and IC 5-3-1-4, the Issuer held a public hearing, and upon finding that the Projects and the proposed financing thereof to induce the construction of a multi-family residential development in the 9<sup>th</sup> Street Corridor Allocation Area ("Facility") will create additional employment opportunities in the City of Goshen, Indiana ("City"), will assist the City with the existing housing shortage, will benefit the health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of City and the State of Indiana and will comply with the purposes and provisions of the Act, adopted an ordinance approving the proposed financing; and

WHEREAS, Indiana Code, Title 36, Article 7, Chapter 14 provides that a redevelopment commission may pledge certain incremental property taxes to pay, in whole or in part, amounts due on the Series 2023 Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Goshen Redevelopment Commission ("Redevelopment Commission") has created, consolidated and enlarged the Consolidated River Race/US 33 Economic Development Area ("Area"), and an allocation area coterminous with the Area known as the Consolidated River Race/US 33 Allocation Area in accordance with IC 36-7-14-39, and adopted an economic development plan, as amended (collectively, "Original Plan"), which Original Plan contained specific recommendations for economic development in the Area, pursuant to Declaratory Resolution No. 02-2012 (as amended to date), as confirmed by Confirmatory Resolution No. 26-2012 (as amended to date), after public hearings (collectively, "Area Resolution"); and

WHEREAS, the Area Resolution established the 9<sup>th</sup> Street Corridor Allocation Area ("Allocation Area") for the purpose of capturing real property taxes generated from the incremental assessed value of real property located in the Allocation Area; and

WHEREAS, the Act provides that such Bonds may be secured by a trust indenture between the Issuer and a corporate trustee; and

WHEREAS, the Financing Agreement provides for the use of the proceeds of the Bonds to complete the Projects, and, pursuant to this Indenture, the Issuer will assign certain of its rights under the Financing Agreement to the Trustee; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to this Indenture, the Bonds shall be payable solely from TIF Revenues and proceeds from the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the execution and delivery of this Trust Indenture, and the issuance of the Bonds hereunder, have been in all respects duly and validly authorized by an ordinance duly passed and approved by the Issuer; and

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Commission has, by resolution, pledged TIF Revenues to the Issuer to be applied to the repayment of the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Bonds and the Trustee's certificate of authentication to be endorsed thereon are all to be substantially in the following form, with necessary and appropriate variations, omissions and insertions as permitted or required by this Indenture, to-wit:

It is not relying on Ice Miller LLP or Baker Tilly Municipal Advisors, LLC for information concerning the financial status of the Issuer or the Redevelopment Commission or the ability of the Issuer or the Redevelopment Commission to honor their financial obligations or other covenants under the Series 2023 Bonds, the Indenture or the Financing Agreement. It is understood that the projection of TIF Revenues (as defined in the TIF Resolution) prepared by Baker Tilly Municipal Advisors, LLC in connection with the issuance of the Series 2023 Bonds has been based on estimates of the investment in real property provided by the Company.

3. It understands that the Issuer's collection of the TIF Revenues may be limited by operation of IC 6-1.1-20.6, which provides taxpayers with tax credits for property taxes attributable to different classes of property in an amount that exceeds certain percentages of the gross assessed value of that property. It further understands that the neither the Issuer nor the Redevelopment Commission may levy a property tax or borrow money to make up any shortfall due to the application of this credit.

4. It is acquiring the Series 2023 Bonds for its own account with no present intent to resell; and will not sell, convey, pledge or otherwise transfer the Series 2023 Bonds without prior compliance with applicable registration and disclosure requirements of state and federal securities laws.

5. It understands that the Series 2023 Bonds have not been registered under the 1933 Act and, unless so registered, may not be sold without registration under the 1933 Act or an exemption therefrom. It is aware that it may transfer or sell the Series 2023 Bonds only if the Trustee shall first have received: (i) a satisfactory opinion of counsel that the sale or transfer will not violate the 1933 Act, the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and the Investment Company Act of 1940 and regulations issued pursuant to such Acts; or (ii) a no-action letter of the staff of the Securities and Exchange Commission that the staff will recommend that no action be taken with respect to such sale or transfer; or (iii) a certificate stating that it reasonably believes that the transferee is a "Qualified Institutional Buyer" within the meaning of Section (a) of Rule 144A ("Rule 144A") promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the 1933 Act and has informed the transferee of the transfer restrictions applicable to the Series 2023 Bonds and that the transferor may be relying upon Rule 144A with respect to the transfer of the Series 2023 Bonds.

6. It has investigated the security for the Series 2023 Bonds, including the availability of TIF Revenues to its satisfaction, and it understands that the Series 2023 Bonds are payable solely from TIF Revenues.

7. It recognizes that the opinions it has received express the professional judgment of the attorneys participating in the transaction as to the legal issues addressed herein. It also recognizes that by rendering such opinions, the attorneys do not become insurers or guarantors of that expression of professional judgment, of the transaction opined upon, or of the future performance of parties to such transaction. Nor does the rendering of the opinions guarantee the outcome of any legal dispute that may arise out of the transaction.

8. It understands that the Issuer has no continuing disclosure obligations with regard to the Series 2023 Bonds.

9. It understands that on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization proclaimed the Coronavirus (COVID-19) to be a pandemic. In an effort to lessen the risk of transmission of COVID-19, the United States government, state governments, local governments and private industries have taken measures to limit social interactions in an effort to limit the spread of COVID-19, affecting business activities and impacting global, state and local commerce and financial markets. The emergence of COVID-19 and the spread thereof is an emerging and evolving issue. As the Issuer continues its efforts to contain and limit the spread COVID-19

disease, future tax and other revenue collections may deviate from anticipated and historical collections and may have an adverse impact on the financial position and operations of the Issuer and its ability to fund debt obligations, including the bonds in accordance with its terms. The Issuer is not able to predict and makes no representations as to the economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the Issuer or its financial position.

10. [It understands that interest on the Series 2023 Bonds is taxable for federal income tax purposes.]

It is provided in the Indenture that the Issuer may hereafter issue Additional Bonds (as defined in the Indenture) from time to time under certain terms and conditions contained therein. (Such Additional Bonds and the Series 2023 Bonds are hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Bonds.") Reference is made to the Indenture and to all indentures supplemental thereto for a description of the nature and extent of the security, the rights, duties and obligations of the Issuer and the Trustee, the rights of the holders of the Bonds, the issuance of Additional Bonds and the terms on which the Bonds are or may be issued and secured, and to all the provisions of which the holder hereof by the acceptance of this Series 2023 Bond assents.

The Series 2023 Bonds are issuable in registered form in \$100,000 denominations and thereafter in integral multiples \$1,000 thereof. This Series 2023 Bond is transferable by the registered holder hereof in person or by its attorney duly authorized in writing at the payment office of the Trustee, but only in the manner, subject to the limitations and upon payment of the charges provided in the Indenture and upon surrender and cancellation of this Series 2023 Bond. Upon such transfer a new registered Bond will be issued to the transferee in exchange therefor.

The Issuer, the Trustee and the Paying Agent may deem and treat the Registered Owner hereof as the absolute owner hereof for the purpose of receiving payment of or on account of principal hereof and premium, if any, hereon and interest due hereon and for all other purposes and neither the Issuer, the Trustee nor the Paying Agent shall be affected by any notice to the contrary.

If sufficient funds are on deposit in the Bond Fund pursuant to Section 5.1 of the Indenture, the Series 2023 Bonds shall be subject to redemption prior to maturity at the option of the Issuer on any date upon thirty (30) days' notice, in whole or in part, in such order of maturity as the Issuer shall direct and by lot within maturities, on any date, from any moneys made available for that purpose, at face value, with no premium, plus in each case accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption.

If any of the Series 2023 Bonds are called for redemption as aforesaid, notice thereof identifying the Series 2023 Bonds to be redeemed will be given by mailing a copy of the redemption notice by first class mail not less than thirty (30) days prior to the date fixed for redemption to the Registered Owner of the Series 2023 Bonds to be redeemed at the address shown on the registration books; provided, however, that failure to give such notice by mailing, or any defect therein with respect to any registered Series 2023 Bond, shall not affect the validity of any proceedings for the redemption of other Series 2023 Bonds.

If any of the Series 2023 Bonds are called for redemption as aforesaid, notice thereof identifying the Series 2023 Bonds to be redeemed will be given by mailing a copy of the redemption notice by first class mail not less than thirty (30) days prior to the date fixed for redemption to the Registered Owner of the Series 2023 Bonds to be redeemed at the address shown on the registration books; provided, however, that failure to give such notice by mailing, or any defect therein with respect to any registered Series 2023 Bond, shall not affect the validity of any proceedings for the redemption of other Series 2023 Bonds.

All Series 2023 Bonds so called for redemption will cease to bear interest on the specified redemption date, provided funds for their redemption are on deposit at the place of payment at that time, shall no longer be protected by the Indenture and shall not be deemed to be outstanding under the provisions of the Indenture.

This Series 2023 Bond is transferable by the Registered Owner hereof at the payment office of the Trustee upon surrender and cancellation of this Series 2023 Bond and on presentation of a duly executed written instrument of transfer and thereupon a new Series 2023 Bond or Series 2023 Bonds of the same aggregate principal amount and maturity and in authorized denominations will be issued to the transferee or transferees in exchange therefor, subject to all terms herein.

The Series 2023 Bonds, and the interest payable thereon, do not and shall not represent or constitute a debt of the Issuer within the meaning of the provisions of the constitution or statutes of the State of Indiana or a pledge of the faith and credit of the Issuer. The Series 2023 Bonds as to both principal and interest, are not an obligation or liability of the State of Indiana, or of any political subdivision or taxing authority thereof, but are a special limited obligation of the Issuer and payable solely and only from the trust estate consisting of funds and accounts held under the Indenture and the TIF Revenues pledged and assigned for their payment in accordance with the Indenture ("Trust Estate"). Neither the faith and credit nor the taxing power of the Issuer, the Redevelopment Commission, the State of Indiana or any political subdivision or taxing authority thereof is pledged to the payment of the principal of or, premium, if any, or the interest on this Series 2023 Bond. The Series 2023 Bonds do not grant the owners or holders thereof any right to have the Issuer, the State of Indiana or its General Assembly, or any political subdivision or taxing authority of the State of Indiana, levy any taxes or appropriate any funds for the payment of the principal of, premium, if any, or interest on the Series 2023 Bonds. No covenant or agreement contained in the Series 2023 Bonds or the Indenture shall be deemed to be a covenant or agreement of any member, director, officer, agent, attorney or employee of the Redevelopment Commission, the Goshen Economic Development Commission ("Commission") or the Issuer in his or her individual capacity, and no member, director, officer, agent, attorney or employee of the Redevelopment Commission, the Commission or the Issuer shall be liable personally on the Series 2023 Bonds or be subject to any personal liability or accountability by reason of the issuance of the Series 2023 Bonds.

The holder of this Series 2023 Bond shall have no right to enforce the provisions of the Indenture or to institute action to enforce the covenants therein, or to take any action with respect to any event of default under the Indenture, or to institute, appear in or defend any suit or other proceedings with respect thereto, except as provided in the Indenture. In certain events, on the conditions, in the manner and with the effect set forth in the Indenture, the principal of all the Bonds issued under the Indenture and then outstanding may become or may be declared due and

payable before the stated maturity thereof, together with interest accrued thereon. Modifications or alterations of the Indenture, or of any supplements thereto, may be made to the extent and in the circumstances permitted by the Indenture. The Issuer's obligation to pay TIF Revenues shall not be subject to acceleration.

It is hereby certified that all conditions, acts and things required to exist, happen and be performed under the laws of the State of Indiana and under the Indenture precedent to and in the issuance of this Series 2023 Bond, exist, have happened and have been performed, and that the issuance, authentication and delivery of this Series 2023 Bond have been duly authorized by the Issuer.

This Series 2023 Bond shall not be valid or become obligatory for any purpose or be entitled to any security or benefit under the Indenture until the certificate of authentication hereon shall have been duly executed by the Trustee.

## ARTICLE I.

### DEFINITIONS

Section 1.1. Terms Defined. In addition to the words and terms elsewhere defined in this Indenture, the following words and terms as used in this Indenture shall have the following meanings unless the context or use indicates another or different meaning or intent:

"Additional Bonds" shall have the meaning assigned in Section 2.8 of this Indenture.

"Allocation Area" means the 9<sup>th</sup> Street Corridor Allocation Area.

"Annual Fees" means annual fees of the Trustee and reasonable (in an amount not to exceed \$5,000) annual fees and expenses incurred by the Issuer related to monitoring Ariel Tax Increment and Future Tax Increment.

"Area" means the Consolidated River Race/US 33 Economic Development Area.

"Authorized Representative" means: (i) as to the Company, any officer of the Company or any other person certified by an officer of the Company to be such, and shall serve as Authorized Representative for the Company; and (ii) as to the Issuer, any person so designated by the Mayor and authorized to serve as Authorized Representative for the Issuer.

"Bondholder" or any similar term means the registered owner of a Bond.

"Bond Purchase Agreement" means the purchase agreement dated \_\_\_\_\_, 2023 between the Issuer and the Bond Purchaser.

"Bond Purchaser" means Legacy Communities, Inc., a corporation duly organized, existing and authorized to do business under the laws of the State of Indiana.

"Bonds" means any Bonds issued pursuant to this Indenture, including the Series 2023 Bonds and any Additional Bonds.

"Code" shall mean the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended and in effect as of the date of delivery of the original bonds.

"Company" means AP Cycleworks LLC, an Indiana limited liability company duly organized, existing and authorized to do business under the laws of the State of Indiana, or any successors thereto permitted under Section 3.3 of the Financing Agreement.

"Costs of Construction" means the categorical costs of providing for an "economic development project" as defined and set forth in the Act as follows:

(i) the "Bond Issuance Costs," namely the costs, fees and expenses incurred or to be incurred by the Issuer and Redevelopment Commission in connection with the issuance and sale of the Series 2023 Bonds, the fees and disbursements of Bond Counsel, fees of the Issuer or Redevelopment Commission's municipal advisor, the fees of the Issuer

and Redevelopment Commission's counsel, the acceptance fee and first year annual administrative fee of the Trustee, application fees and expenses, publication costs, the filing and recording fees in connection with any filings or recording necessary under the Indenture, the out-of-pocket costs of the Issuer, the costs of preparing or printing the Series 2023 Bonds and the documentation supporting the issuance of the Series 2023 Bonds, the costs of reproducing documents, and any other costs of a similar nature reasonably incurred;

(ii) the cost of insurance of all kinds that may be required or necessary in connection with the construction of the Projects;

(iii) all costs and expenses which Issuer or Company shall be required to pay, under the terms of any contract or contracts (including the architectural and engineering, development, and legal services with respect thereto) for materials, equipment and the construction of the Projects; and

(iv) any sums required to reimburse the Issuer, Redevelopment Commission or Company for advances made by either of them for any of the above items or for any other costs incurred and for work done by either of them which are properly chargeable to the Projects.

"Development Agreement" means the Development Agreement dated April 27, 2022 among the City, the Redevelopment Commission and the Company.

"Event of Default" means those events of default specified in and defined by Section 7.1 hereof.

"Facility" means a multi-family residential development in the 9<sup>th</sup> Street Corridor Allocation Area.

"Financing Agreement" means the Financing and Covenant Agreement, dated as of \_\_\_\_\_ 1, 2023, between the Company and the Issuer and all amendments and supplements thereto.

"Indenture" means this instrument as originally executed or as it may from time to time be amended or supplemented pursuant to Article IX.

"Opinion of Counsel" shall mean an opinion in writing signed by legal counsel who may be an employee of or counsel to the Company and who shall be satisfactory to the Trustee in its reasonable discretion.

"Outstanding" or "Bonds outstanding" means all Bonds which have been duly authenticated, and delivered by the Trustee under this Indenture, except:

(a) Bonds canceled after purchase in the open market or because of payment at or redemption prior to maturity;

(b) Bonds for the redemption of which cash or investments (but only to the extent that the full faith and credit of the United States of America are pledged to the timely payment thereof) shall have been theretofore deposited with the Trustee (whether upon or prior to the maturity or redemption date of any such Bonds); provided that if such Bonds are to be redeemed prior to the maturity thereof, notice of such redemption shall have been given or arrangements satisfactory to the Trustee shall have been made therefor, or waiver of such notice satisfactory in form to the Trustee, shall have been filed with the Trustee; and

(c) Bonds in lieu of which others have been authenticated under Section 2.9.

"Requisite Bondholders" means the holders of 75% in aggregate principal amount of Bonds.

"Series 2023 Bonds" or "Bonds" means the [Taxable] Economic Development Revenue Bonds, Series 2023 (Ariel Project) in the aggregate principal amount of \$\_\_\_\_\_.

"Tax Increment" means all real property tax proceeds attributable to the assessed valuation of real property in the Allocation Area in excess of the assessed valuation described in IC 36-7-14-39(b)(1), as such statutory provision exists on the date of issuance of the Series 2023 Bonds.

"TIF Revenues" means 100% of the Tax Increment generated in the Allocation Area and deposited into the Redevelopment Commission's Allocation Fund, minus the Annual Fees, received by the Redevelopment Commission and pledged to the Issuer for payment of the Bonds pursuant to the TIF Pledge Resolution.

"TIF Pledge Resolution" means the amended and restated resolution of the Redevelopment Commission adopted on April 11, 2023, pledging TIF Revenues to the Issuer for the payment of debt service on the Series 2023 Bonds.

"Trust Estate" means the funds and accounts, TIF Revenues and other assets described in the Granting Clauses of this Indenture.

(b) All references in this instrument to designated "Articles," "Sections" and other subdivisions are to the designated Articles, Sections and other subdivisions of this instrument as originally executed. The words "herein," "hereof" and "hereunder" and other words of similar import refer to this Indenture as a whole and not to any particular Article, Section or other subdivision.

(c) The terms defined in this Article have the meanings assigned to them in this Article and include the plural as well as the singular and the singular as well as the plural.

(d) All accounting terms not otherwise defined herein have the meanings assigned to them in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles as consistently applied.

(e) Any terms not defined herein but defined in the Financing Agreement shall have the same meaning herein.

(f) The terms defined elsewhere in this Indenture shall have the meanings therein prescribed for them.

## ARTICLE II.

### THE SERIES 2023 BONDS

Section 2.1. Authorized Amount of Series 2023 Bonds. No Series 2023 Bonds may be issued under the provisions of this Indenture except in accordance with this Article. The aggregate principal amount of the Series 2023 Bonds (other than Series 2023 Bonds issued in substitution therefor pursuant to Section 2.9 hereof) that may be issued is hereby expressly limited to \$ \_\_\_\_\_. Additional Bonds may be issued as provided in Section 2.8 hereof.

Section 2.2. Issuance of Series 2023 Bonds. The Series 2023 Bonds shall be designated "[Taxable] Economic Development Revenue Bonds, Series 2023 (Ariel Project)." The Series 2023 Bonds shall be originally issuable as fully registered Series 2023 Bonds in the principal amount of \$ \_\_\_\_\_, in denominations of \$100,000 and integral multiples of \$1,000 thereof and shall be lettered and numbered R-1 and upward. Interest on the Series 2023 Bonds shall be at the rate of \_\_\_% per annum and shall be paid to the owners of such Bonds determined as of the close of business of the Record Date next preceding each Interest Payment Date at the registered addresses of such owners as they shall appear on the registration books of the Trustee notwithstanding the cancellation of any such Bonds upon any exchange or transfer thereof subsequent to the Record Date and prior to such Interest Payment Date, except that, if and to the extent that there shall be a default in the payment of the interest due on such interest payment date, such defaulted interest shall be paid to the owners in whose name any such Bonds (or any Bond issued upon transfer or exchange thereof) are registered at the close of business of the Record Date next preceding the date of payment of such defaulted interest. Payment of interest to all Bondholders shall be by check drawn on the main office of the Paying Agent and mailed to such Bondholder one business day prior to each Interest Payment Date. The Series 2023 Bonds shall be dated as of the date of their delivery and shall accrue interest from their date of issuance. Interest shall be computed on the basis of a 360-day year consisting of twelve 30-day months. The interest on the Series 2023 Bonds shall be payable on each January 1 and July 1, commencing on \_\_\_\_\_ 1, 202\_\_.

Proceeds of the Series 2023 Bonds shall be advanced from time to time as provided in Section 4.4.

The Series 2023 Bonds shall bear interest from the Interest Payment Date next preceding the date of authentication thereof, unless such date of authentication shall be subsequent to a Record Date in which case they shall bear interest from the Interest Payment Date with respect to such Record Date, provided, however that if, as shown by the records of the Trustee, interest on the Series 2023 Bonds shall be in default, Series 2023 Bonds issued in exchange for Series 2023 Bonds surrendered for transfer or exchange shall bear interest from the date to which interest has been paid in full on the Series 2023 Bonds or, if no interest has been paid on the Series 2023 Bonds, from the date of issuance and delivery of the Series 2023 Bonds. Series 2023 Bonds authenticated on or prior to December 15, 2023 shall bear interest from the date of delivery of the Series 2023 Bonds.

The Series 2023 Bonds shall mature on [January] [July] 1, 20\_\_.

Section 2.3. Payment on Series 2023 Bonds. The principal of and interest on the Series 2023 Bonds shall be payable in any coin or currency of the United States of America which, on the dates of payment thereof, is legal tender for the payment of public and private debts. The final payments on the Series 2023 Bonds shall be payable at the corporate trust operations office of the Trustee. All other payments on the Series 2023 Bonds shall be made to the person appearing on the Series 2023 Bond registration books of the Trustee as the registered owner of the Series 2023 Bonds by check mailed to the Registered Owner thereof as shown on the registration books of the Trustee. Notwithstanding anything contained herein, the Series 2023 Bonds shall not need to be presented for payment except upon final maturity or redemption in full.

Section 2.4. Execution; Limited Obligation. The Series 2023 Bonds shall be executed on behalf of the Issuer with the manual or facsimile signature of its Mayor and attested with the manual or the facsimile signature of its Clerk-Treasurer and shall have impressed or printed thereon the corporate seal of the Issuer. Such facsimiles shall have the same force and effect as if such officer had manually signed the Series 2023 Bonds. If any officer whose signature or facsimile signature shall appear on the Series 2023 Bonds shall cease to be such officer before the delivery of such Series 2023 Bonds, such signature or such facsimile shall, nevertheless, be valid and sufficient for all purposes, the same as if he had remained in office until delivery. The use of electronic signatures by the Mayor and Clerk-Treasurer are authorized and affirmed with full valid legal effect and enforceability.

The Series 2023 Bonds, and the interest payable thereon, do not and shall not represent or constitute a debt of the Issuer, the State of Indiana or any political subdivision or taxing authority thereof within the meaning of the provisions of the constitution or statutes of the State of Indiana or a pledge of the faith and credit of the Issuer, the State of Indiana or any political subdivision or taxing authority thereof. The Series 2023 Bonds, as to both principal and interest, are not an obligation or liability of the State of Indiana, or of any political subdivision or taxing authority thereof, but are a special limited obligation of the Issuer and are payable solely and only from the trust estate consisting of funds and accounts held under the Indenture and the TIF Revenues pledged and assigned for their payment in accordance with the Indenture ("Trust Estate"). Neither the faith and credit nor the taxing power of the Issuer, the Redevelopment Commission, the State of Indiana or any political subdivision or taxing authority thereof is pledged to the payment of the principal of, or premium, if any, or interest on the Series 2023 Bond. The Series 2023 Bonds do not grant the owners or holders thereof any right to have the Issuer, the State of Indiana or its General Assembly, or any political subdivision or taxing authority of the State of Indiana, levy any taxes or appropriate any funds for the payment of the principal of, or premium, if any, or interest on the Series 2023 Bonds. No covenant or agreement contained in the Series 2023 Bonds or the Indenture shall be deemed to be a covenant or agreement of any member, director, officer, agent, attorney or employee of the Redevelopment Commission, the Commission or the Issuer in his or her individual capacity, and no member, director, officer, agent, attorney or employee of the Redevelopment Commission, the Commission or the Issuer shall be liable personally on the Series 2023 Bonds or be subject to any personal liability or accountability by reason of the issuance of the Series 2023 Bonds.

Section 2.5. Authentication. No Series 2023 Bonds shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose or entitled to any security or benefit under this Indenture unless and until the certificate of authentication on such Series 2023 Bond substantially in the form hereinabove set forth shall have

been duly executed by the Trustee, and such executed certificate of the Trustee upon any such Series 2023 Bond shall be conclusive evidence that such Series 2023 Bond has been authenticated and delivered under this Indenture. The Trustee's certificate of authentication on the Series 2023 Bonds shall be deemed to have been executed by it if signed by an authorized officer of the Trustee, but it shall not be necessary that the same officer sign the certificate of authentication on all of the Series 2023 Bonds issued hereunder.

Section 2.6. Form of Series 2023 Bonds. The Series 2023 Bonds issued under this Indenture shall be substantially in the form hereinabove set forth with such appropriate variations, omissions and insertions as are permitted or required by this Indenture or deemed necessary by the Trustee.

Section 2.7. Delivery of Series 2023 Bonds. Upon the execution and delivery of this Indenture, the Issuer shall execute and deliver to the Trustee the Series 2023 Bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$\_\_\_\_\_. The Trustee shall authenticate the Series 2023 Bonds and deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of:

- (i) A copy, duly certified by the Clerk-Treasurer of the Issuer, of the amended and restated ordinance adopted and approved by the Issuer authorizing the execution and delivery of the Financing Agreement and this Indenture and the issuance of the Series 2023 Bonds.
- (ii) A copy, duly certified by the Secretary of the Redevelopment Commission, of the amended and restated resolution adopted and approved by the Redevelopment Commission pledging the TIF Revenues to the payment of the Series 2023 Bonds.
- (iii) Executed counterparts of the Financing Agreement and Indenture.
- (iv) A written request of the Issuer to the Trustee requesting the Trustee to authenticate, or cause to be authenticated, and deliver the Series 2023 Bonds in the principal amount of \$\_\_\_\_\_ to the purchasers thereof.
- (v) An opinion of nationally recognized bond counsel.

The proceeds of the Series 2023 Bonds shall be paid over to the Trustee and deposited to the credit of various Funds as hereinafter provided under Section 3.1 hereof.

Section 2.8. Issuance of Additional Bonds. With the consent of the Requisite Bondholders, the Series 2023 Bonds issued under this Indenture in addition to the Series 2023 Bonds ("Additional Bonds") may be authenticated and delivered from time to time for one or more of the purposes of (i) refunding entirely the Series 2023 Bonds outstanding hereunder, if such Bonds may otherwise be refunded, (ii) advance refunding entirely one or more series of Bonds outstanding hereunder, regardless of whether such Bonds may otherwise be refunded, if the same is then permitted by law by depositing with the Trustee, in trust for the sole benefit of such Bonds, cash or investments (but only to the extent that the full faith and credit of the United States of America are pledged to the timely payment thereof) in a principal amount which will, together with the income or increment to accrue thereon, be sufficient to pay and redeem (when redeemable) and discharge such series of Bonds at or before their respective maturity dates, and (iii) financing

the cost or estimated cost of completing the Projects or of acquiring and/or constructing additional improvements to the Projects, and, in each case, obtaining additional funds to pay the costs to be incurred in connection with the issuance of such Additional Bonds, to establish reserves with respect thereto and to pay interest during the estimated construction period of completing the additional improvements, if any.

Prior to the delivery by the Issuer of any such Additional Bonds there shall be filed with the Trustee:

(i) A supplement to this Indenture executed by the Issuer and the Trustee authorizing the issuance of such Additional Bonds and specifying the terms thereof.

(ii) The supplement or amendment to the Financing Agreement and the other instruments, documents, certificates, and opinions referred to in Section 7.1 of the Financing Agreement.

(iii) A copy, duly certified by the Clerk-Treasurer of the Issuer, of the amended and restated bond ordinance theretofore adopted and approved by the Issuer authorizing the execution and delivery of such supplemental indenture and such supplement to the Financing Agreement and the issuance of such Additional Bonds.

(iv) A written request of the Issuer to the Trustee to authenticate and deliver such Additional Bonds.

(v) For additional Bonds payable from TIF Revenues, a certificate showing the requirements for such additional obligations contained in the resolution or ordinance pledging the TIF Revenues shall have been met.

Any Additional Bonds issued in accordance with the terms of this Section 2.8 shall be secured by this Indenture but such Additional Bonds may bear such date or dates, such interest rate or rates, and with such maturities, redemption dates and premiums as may be agreed upon by the Issuer, at the direction of the Company, and the purchaser of such Additional Bonds.

Section 2.9. Mutilated, Lost, Stolen, or Destroyed Series 2023 Bonds. If any Series 2023 Bond is mutilated, lost, stolen or destroyed, the Issuer may execute and the Trustee may authenticate a new Series 2023 Bond of like date, maturity and denomination as that mutilated, lost, stolen or destroyed; provided that, in the case of any mutilated Series 2023 Bond, such mutilated Series 2023 Bond shall first be surrendered to the Issuer, and in the case of any lost, stolen or destroyed Series 2023 Bond, there shall be first furnished to the Trustee evidence of such loss, theft or destruction satisfactory to the Trustee, together with indemnity satisfactory to it.

If any such Series 2023 Bond shall have matured, instead of issuing a duplicate Series 2023 Bond the Issuer may pay the same without surrender thereof; provided, however, that in the case of a lost, stolen or destroyed Series 2023 Bond, there shall be first furnished to the Trustee evidence of such loss, theft or destruction satisfactory to the Trustee, together with indemnity satisfactory to it. The Trustee may charge the holder or owner of such Series 2023 Bond with their reasonable fees and expenses in this connection. Any Series 2023 Bond issued pursuant to this Section 2.9

shall be deemed part of the original series of Series 2023 Bonds in respect of which it was issued and an original additional contractual obligation of the Issuer.

Section 2.10. Registration and Exchange of Series 2023 Bonds; Persons Treated as Owners. The Issuer shall cause books for the registration and for the transfer of the Series 2023 Bonds as provided in this Indenture to be kept by the Trustee which is hereby constituted and appointed the registrar of the Issuer. Upon surrender for transfer of any fully registered Series 2023 Bond at the principal office of the Trustee, duly endorsed by, or accompanied by a written instrument or instruments of transfer in form satisfactory to the Trustee and duly executed by the registered owner or his attorney duly authorized in writing, the Issuer shall execute and the Trustee shall authenticate and deliver in the name of the transferee or transferees a new fully registered Series 2023 Bond or Bonds of the same series and the same maturity for a like aggregate principal amount. The execution by the Issuer of any fully registered Series 2023 Bond without coupons of any denomination shall constitute full and due authorization of such denomination, and the Trustee shall thereby be authorized to authenticate and deliver such registered Series 2023 Bond. The Trustee shall not be required to transfer or exchange any fully registered Series 2023 Bond during the period between the Record Date and any interest payment date of such Series 2023 Bond, nor to transfer or exchange any Series 2023 Bond after the mailing of notice calling such Bond for redemption has been made, nor during a period of fifteen (15) days next preceding mailing of a notice of redemption of any Series 2023 Bonds.

As to any fully registered Series 2023 Bond, the person in whose name the same shall be registered shall be deemed and regarded as the absolute owner thereof for all purposes, and payment of principal or interest thereon, shall be made only to or upon the order of the registered owner thereof or its legal representative, but such registration may be changed as hereinabove provided. All such payments shall be valid and effectual to satisfy and discharge the liability upon such Series 2023 Bond to the extent of the sum or sums so paid.

(End of Article II)

ARTICLE III.

APPLICATION OF SERIES 2023 BOND PROCEEDS

Section 3.1. Deposit of Funds. The Issuer shall deposit with Trustee in the Construction Fund \$\_\_\_\_\_ of the proceeds from the sale of the Series 2023 Bonds. \$\_\_\_\_\_ of the proceeds from the sale of the Series 2023 Bonds deposited into the Construction Fund shall be used to pay Bond Issuance Costs pursuant to Section 4.4(a) of the Indenture. The Bond Purchaser will make additional advances to purchase the Series 2023 Bonds from time to time. Such proceeds shall be deposited with the Trustee in the Construction Fund. The proceeds of the Series 2023 Bonds shall be paid out immediately following closing or from time to time upon submission to the Trustee of a written request for funds by the Authorized Representative of the Company. Such requisition shall be substantially in the form attached as Exhibit B.

## ARTICLE IV.

### REVENUE AND FUNDS

Section 4.1. Source of Payment of Bonds. The Bonds herein authorized and all payments to be made by the Issuer hereunder are not general obligations of the Issuer but are limited obligations payable solely from the Trust Estate as authorized by the Act and as provided herein. No covenant or agreement contained in the Bonds or this Indenture shall be deemed to be a covenant or agreement of the Issuer or of any member, director, officer, agent, attorney or employee of the Issuer in his or her individual capacity, and neither the Issuer nor any member, director, officer, agent, attorney, or employee of the Issuer executing the Bonds shall be liable personally on the Bonds or be subject to any personal liability or accountability by reason of the issuance of the Bonds.

Section 4.2. Bond Fund. The Trustee shall establish and maintain, so long as any of the Bonds are outstanding, a separate fund to be known as the "Bond Fund." Money in the Bond Fund shall be applied as provided in this Section 4.2.

In addition, there shall be deposited in the Bond Fund, as and when received, (a) all TIF Revenues; and (b) all interest and other income derived from investments of Bond Fund moneys as provided herein. Subject to the funding source limitations in this Indenture and the final maturity date of the Bonds, the Issuer hereby covenants and agrees that so long as any of the Series 2023 Bonds issued hereunder are outstanding, it will deposit, or cause to be paid to Trustee for deposit in the Bond Fund for its account, all the TIF Revenues, as and when received by the Issuer. Nothing herein should be construed as requiring Issuer to deposit or cause to be paid to the Trustee for deposit in the Bond Fund, funds from any source other than receipts derived from the TIF Revenues, Financing Agreement and proceeds from the Series 2023 Bonds.

The Clerk-Treasurer of the Issuer shall set aside immediately upon receipt of the Tax Increment into the Issuer's Allocation Fund as created by IC 36-7-14 and shall deposit, or cause to be delivered to the Trustee for deposit all of the TIF Revenues into the Bond Fund in the manner prescribed in this Section 4.2 and in Section 4.6.

Moneys in the Bond Fund shall be used by the Trustee first to pay the Annual Fees of the Trustee and then to pay interest and as much principal on the Bonds as possible based on the amount of TIF Revenues received by the Trustee.

Section 4.3. RESERVED

Section 4.4. Construction Fund. The Issuer shall establish with the Trustee a separate fund to be known as the Construction Fund, to the credit of which the deposits are to be made as required by Section 3.1 hereof.

(a) The Trustee shall deposit \$\_\_\_\_\_ from the sale of the Series 2023 Bonds into the Construction Fund to pay Bond Issuance Costs. The Bond Issuance Costs set forth in Exhibit A shall be wire transferred at closing to the entities listed as authorized by the Mayor and the Clerk-Treasurer, the authorization evidenced by the execution of this Indenture. Other costs of issuance

shall be paid upon submission of an affidavit signed by the Mayor and the Clerk-Treasurer. Execution of this Indenture shall be authorization for these payments.

(b) Except as set forth in subparagraph (a) of this Section 4.4, moneys on deposit in the Construction Fund shall be paid out from time to time by the Trustee to or upon the order of the Issuer in order to pay, or as reimbursement to the Issuer or the Company for payment made, for the Costs of Construction, upon receipt by the Trustee of the written request signed by the Authorized Representative of the Company, approved by the Redevelopment Commission, in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B:

(1) stating that the costs of an aggregate amount set forth in such written request have been made or incurred and were necessary for the construction of the Projects and were made or incurred in accordance with the construction contracts, plans and specifications, or purchase contracts therefor then in effect or that the amounts set forth in such written request are for allowable Costs for Construction;

(2) stating that the amount paid or to be paid, as set forth in such written request, is reasonable and represents a part of the amount payable for the Costs of Construction all in accordance with the cost budget; and that such payment was not paid in advance of the time, if any, fixed for payment and was made in accordance with the terms of any contracts applicable thereto and in accordance with usual and customary practice under existing conditions;

(3) stating that no part of the costs was included in any written request previously filed with the Trustee under the provisions hereof;

(4) stating that such costs are appropriate for the expenditure of proceeds of the Bonds under the Act; and

(5) stating a recap of vendors and the amount paid;

(c) Disposition of Construction Fund Moneys After Completion. If, after payment by the Trustee of all orders theretofore tendered to the Trustee under the provisions of subparagraph (a) of this Section 4.4 and after receipt by the Trustee of the completion certificate or certificates mentioned in subparagraph (b) of this Section 4.4, there shall remain any balance of moneys in the Construction Fund, the Trustee shall transfer all moneys then in the Construction Fund (except moneys reserved to pay any disputed claims described in the completion certificate required in Section 4.4(b) hereof) to the Bond Fund. The Trustee is hereby directed by the Issuer to use any amount transferred to the Bond Fund from the Series 2023 Bonds, to redeem the Series 2023 Bonds pursuant to Section 5.1 hereof at the earliest redemption date.

Section 4.5. Rebate Fund. There is hereby created and ordered maintained as a separate account in the custody of the Trustee a fund to be designated the Rebate Fund provided, however, that the Trustee shall not be required to maintain such account on its records until such time as any deposit is actually required to be made into the Rebate Fund under this Indenture and the Certificate of the Issuer Re: Arbitrage and Federal Tax Matters ("Tax Certificate"). Moneys deposited in the Rebate Fund shall be used to meet any rebate liability of the Issuer under Section 148(f) of the Code and the Treasury Regulations promulgated thereunder. Any provision hereof

to the contrary notwithstanding, amounts credited to the Rebate Fund shall be free and clear of any lien hereunder. The duties and responsibilities of the Issuer provided in this Section 4.5 are to be read and interpreted consistently with the provisions of the Tax Certificate.

The Trustee shall be entitled to rely on the calculations made pursuant to the Tax Certificate by the Issuer and shall not be responsible for any loss or damage resulting from any action taken or omitted to be taken in reliance upon those calculations.

The Issuer shall provide to the Trustee the computations made pursuant to this Section as are required by the Tax Certificate and the Trustee shall keep such records of such computations.

The Trustee shall keep and make available to the Issuer such records concerning the investments of the gross proceeds of the Bonds and the investments of earnings from those investments as may be requested by the Issuer in order to enable the Issuer to make the aforesaid computations as are required under the Tax Certificate.

Section 4.6. TIF Revenues. On or before \_\_\_\_\_ 15 and December 15, commencing [June 15, 202\_][December 15, 202\_], the Issuer shall transfer to the Trustee, to the extent available, all TIF Revenues for deposit to the Bond Fund pursuant to Section 4.2.

Section 4.7. Trust Funds. All moneys and securities received by the Trustee under the provisions of this Indenture, shall be trust funds under the terms hereof and shall not be subject to lien or attachment of any creditor of the Issuer or of the Company. Such moneys shall be held in trust and applied in accordance with the provisions of this Indenture.

Section 4.8. Investment. Moneys on deposit in the Funds established in this Article IV hereof shall be invested as provided in Section 6.8 hereof.

## ARTICLE VI.

### GENERAL COVENANTS

Section 6.1. Payment of Principal and Interest. Subject to the funding source limitations in this Indenture, the Issuer covenants that it will promptly pay the principal of and interest on every Bond issued under this Indenture at the place, on the dates and in the manner provided herein and in the Bonds according to the true intent and meaning thereof. The principal and interest on the Bonds are payable solely and only from the TIF Revenues, and nothing in the Bonds or in this Indenture should be considered as pledging any other funds or assets of the Issuer. The Bonds, and the interest payable thereon, do not and shall not represent or constitute a debt of the Issuer within the meaning of the provisions of the constitution or statutes of the State of Indiana or a pledge of the faith and credit of the Issuer. The Bonds, as to both principal and interest, are not an obligation or liability of the State of Indiana, or of any political subdivision or taxing authority thereof, but are a special limited obligation of the Issuer and are payable solely and only from TIF Revenues. Neither the faith and credit nor the taxing power of the Issuer, the Redevelopment Commission, the State of Indiana or any political subdivision or taxing authority thereof is pledged to the payment of or the principal of and premium, if any, or interest on the Bonds. The Bonds do not grant the owners or holders thereof any right to have the Issuer, the Redevelopment Commission, the State of Indiana or its General Assembly, or any political subdivision or taxing authority of the State of Indiana, levy any taxes or appropriate any funds for the payment of the principal of, or premium, if any, or interest on the Bonds. The Issuer has no taxing power with respect to the Bonds. No covenant or agreement contained in the Bonds or this Indenture shall be deemed to be a covenant or agreement of any member, director, officer, agent, attorney or employee of the Redevelopment Commission, the Commission or the Issuer in his or her individual capacity, and no member, director, officer, agent, attorney or employee of the Redevelopment Commission, the Commission or the Issuer executing the Bonds shall be liable personally on the Bonds or be subject to any personal liability or accountability by reason of the issuance of the Bonds.

Section 6.2. Performance of Covenants. The Issuer covenants that it will faithfully perform at all times any and all covenants, undertakings, stipulations and provisions contained in this Indenture, in any and every Bond executed, authenticated and delivered hereunder and in all proceedings of its members pertaining thereto. The Issuer represents that it is duly authorized under the constitution and laws of the State of Indiana to issue the Bonds authorized herein and to execute this Indenture, pledge the TIF Revenues and assign the Financing Agreement in the manner and to the extent herein set forth; that all action on its part for the issuance of the Bonds and the execution and delivery of this Indenture has been duly and effectively taken, and that the Bonds in the hands of the holders and owners thereof are and will be valid and enforceable obligations of the Issuer according to the import thereof, subject to bankruptcy, insolvency, reorganization, moratorium and other similar laws, judicial decisions and principles of equity relating to or affecting creditors' rights generally and subject to the valid exercise of the constitutional powers of the Issuer, the State of Indiana and the United States of America.

Section 6.3. Ownership; Instruments of Further Assurance. The Issuer represents that at the time of the pledge and assignment thereof the assignment of the Financing Agreement to the Trustee hereby made will be valid and lawful. The Issuer covenants that it will defend its interest

in the Financing Agreement to the Trustee, for the benefit of the holders and owners of the Bonds against the claims and demands of all persons whomsoever. The Issuer covenants that it will do, execute, acknowledge and deliver or cause to be done, executed, acknowledged and delivered, such indentures supplemental hereto and such further acts, instruments and transfers as the Trustee may reasonably require for the better assuring, transferring, mortgaging, conveying, pledging, assigning and confirming unto the Trustee, the Financing Agreement and all payments thereon and thereunder pledged hereby to the payment of the principal, or premium, if any, or interest on the Bonds.

Section 6.4. Filing of Indenture, Financing Agreement and Security Instruments. The Issuer, upon the written direction and at the sole expense of the Company, shall cause this Indenture, the Financing Agreement and all supplements thereto as well as such other security instruments, financing statements and all supplements thereto and other instruments as may be required from time to time to be filed in such manner and in such places as may be required by law in order to fully preserve and protect the lien hereof and the security of the holders and owners of the Bonds and the rights of the Trustee hereunder. This Section 6.4 shall impose no duty to record or file the instruments noted above where filing or recordation is not required by law in order to perfect a security interest. Continuation of financing statements may be filed without consent of the debtor parties thereto.

Section 6.5. Inspection of Books. The Issuer covenants and agrees that all books and documents in its possession relating to the Projects and the revenues derived from the Projects shall at all times be open to inspection by such accountants or other agents as the Trustee may from time to time designate.

Section 6.6. List of Bondholders. The Trustee will keep on file at the principal office of the Trustee a list of names and addresses of the holders of all Bonds. At reasonable times and under reasonable regulations established by the Trustee, said list may be inspected and copied by the Company or by holders and/or owners (or a designated representative thereof) of 25% or more in principal amount of Bonds then outstanding, such ownership and the authority of any such designated representative to be evidenced to the satisfaction of the Trustee.

Section 6.7. Rights Under Financing Agreement. The Issuer agrees that the Trustee in its name or in the name of the Issuer may enforce all rights of the Issuer and all obligations of the Company under and pursuant to the Financing Agreement for and on behalf of the Bondholders, whether or not the Issuer is in default hereunder.

Section 6.8. Investment of Funds. Moneys in the funds established hereunder may be invested in Qualified Investments to the extent and in the manner provided for in Section 3.8 of the Financing Agreement. The Trustee shall not be liable or responsible for any loss resulting from any such investment. The interest accruing thereon and any profit realized from such investments shall be credited, and any loss resulting from such investments shall be charged to the fund in which the money was deposited.

Section 6.9. Non-presentment of Bonds. If any Bond shall not be presented for payment when the principal thereof becomes due, either at maturity, or at the date fixed for redemption thereof, or otherwise, if funds sufficient to pay any such Bond shall have been made available to Paying Agent for the benefit of the holder or holders thereof, all liability of Issuer to

the holder thereof for the payment of such Bond shall forthwith cease, determine and be completely discharged, and thereupon it shall be the duty of Paying Agent to hold such funds for five (5) years without liability for interest thereon, for the benefit of the holder of such Bond, who shall thereafter be restricted exclusively to such funds, for any claim of whatever nature on his part under this Indenture or on, or with respect to, such Bond.

Any moneys so deposited with and held by the Paying Agent not so applied to the payment of Bonds within five (5) years after the date on which the same shall become due shall be repaid by Paying Agent to Issuer and thereafter Bondholders shall be entitled to look only to Issuer for payment, and then only to the extent of the amount so repaid, and Issuer shall not be liable for any interest thereon and shall not be regarded as a trustee of such money.

Section 6.10. Direction of Bondholders. Whenever any action, direction or consent is required of the Trustee, the Trustee shall consult with the holders of the Bonds and shall take such action, give such direction or give such consent as shall be directed by the Requisite Bondholders.

Section 6.11. Tax Covenants. The Issuer shall not use or permit the use of any proceeds of Bonds or any other funds of the Issuer, directly or indirectly, to acquire any securities or obligations, and shall not use or permit the use of any TIF Revenues in any manner, and shall not take or permit to be taken any other action or actions, which would cause any Bond to be an "arbitrage bond" within the meaning of Section 148 of the Code or which would otherwise affect the exclusion of interest on the Bonds from gross income of the recipients thereof for federal income tax purposes.

The Issuer shall at all times do and perform all acts and things permitted by law and necessary or desirable in order to assure that interest paid by the Issuer on the Bonds shall, for federal income tax purposes, be excluded from the gross income of the recipients thereof. In furtherance of this covenant, the Issuer shall execute, deliver and perform tax and arbitrage certificates, which are by this reference incorporated herein and made a part hereof as if set forth herein in full, and by its acceptance of this Indenture, the Trustee acknowledges receipt of the tax and arbitrage certificates and acknowledges their incorporation herein by reference.

Notwithstanding any provision of this Indenture or the Financing Agreement to the contrary, unless otherwise specifically agreed in the Tax Certificate or in a separate written agreement, the Trustee shall not be liable or responsible for any calculation or determination which may be required in connection with, or for the purpose of complying with, Section 148 of the Code, or any successor statute or any regulation, ruling or other judicial or administrative interpretation thereof, including, without limitation, the calculation of amounts required to be paid to the United States of America or the determination of the maximum amount which may be invested in

nonpurpose obligations having a yield higher than the yield on the Bonds, and the Trustee shall not be liable or responsible for monitoring the compliance by the User or the Issuer with any of the requirements of Section 148 of the Code or any applicable regulation, ruling or other judicial or administrative interpretation thereof except as specifically provided in the Tax Certificate.

(End of Article VI)

## ARTICLE VII.

### DEFAULTS AND REMEDIES

Section 7.1. Events of Default. Each of the following events is hereby declared an "event of default," that is to say, if:

(a) payment of any amount payable on the Bonds shall not be made when the same is due and payable by reason other than collection of insufficient TIF Revenues and paid to the Trustee; or

(b) any event of default as defined in Section 5.1 of the Financing Agreement shall occur and be continuing; or

(c) the Issuer shall default in the due and punctual performance of any other of the covenants, conditions, agreements and provisions contained in the Bonds or in this Indenture or any agreement supplemental hereof on the part of the Issuer to be performed, and such default shall continue for thirty (30) days after written notice specifying such default and requiring the same to be remedied shall have been given to the Issuer and the Company by the Trustee; or

(d) the Issuer shall fail to apply collected TIF Revenues in accordance with Article IV of this Indenture; short fall in the amount of TIF Revenues received shall not be an event or default.

Section 7.2. Reserved.

Section 7.3. Remedies; Rights of Bondholders.

(i) If an event of default occurs, the Trustee may pursue any available remedy by suit at law or in equity to enforce the payment of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the Bonds then outstanding, to enforce any obligations of the Issuer hereunder, and of the Issuer and the Company under the Financing Agreement.

(ii) Upon the occurrence of an event of default, and if directed to do so by the Requisite Bondholders and indemnified as provided in Section 8.1 hereof, the Trustee shall be obliged to exercise such one or more of the rights and powers conferred by this Article as the Trustee, being advised by counsel, shall deem most expedient in the interests of the Bondholders.

(iii) No remedy by the terms of this Indenture conferred upon or reserved to the Trustee (or to the Bondholders) is intended to be exclusive of any other remedy, but each and every such remedy shall be cumulative and shall be in addition to any other remedy given to the Trustee or to the Bondholders hereunder or now or hereafter existing at law or in equity or by statute.

(iv) No delay or omission to exercise any right or power accruing upon any event of default shall impair any such right or power or shall be construed to be a waiver of any event of default or acquiescence therein, and every such right and power may be exercised from time to time as may be deemed expedient.

(v) No waiver of any event of default hereunder, whether by the Trustee or by the Bondholders, shall extend to or shall affect any subsequent event of default or shall impair any rights or remedies consequent thereon.

Section 7.4. Right of Bondholders to Direct Proceedings. Anything in this Indenture to the contrary notwithstanding, the holders of all Bonds then outstanding shall have the right, at any time, by an instrument or instruments in writing executed and delivered to the Trustee, to direct the time, the method and place of conducting all proceedings to be taken in connection with the enforcement of the terms and conditions of this Indenture, or for the appointment of a receiver or any other proceedings hereunder; provided, that such direction shall not be otherwise than in accordance with the provisions of law and of this Indenture, and provided that the Trustee is obligated to pursue its remedies under the provisions of Section 7.3 hereof before any other remedies are sought.

Section 7.5. Application of Moneys. All moneys received by the Trustee pursuant to any right given or action taken under the provisions of this Article shall, after payment of the cost and expenses of the proceedings resulting in the collection of such moneys and of the expenses, liabilities and advances incurred or made by the Trustee or the Issuer and the creation of a reasonable reserve for anticipated fees, costs and expenses, be deposited in the Bond Fund and all moneys in the Bond Fund shall be applied as follows:

(a) Unless the principal of all the Bonds shall have become or shall have been declared due and payable, all such moneys shall be applied:

First: To the payment to the persons entitled thereto of all installments of interest then due on the Bonds, in the order of the maturity of the installments of such interest, and if the amount available shall not be sufficient to pay in full any particular installment, then to the payment ratably, according to the amounts due on such installment, to the persons entitled thereto, without any discrimination or privilege; and

Second: To the payment to the persons entitled thereto of the unpaid principal of and premium, if any, of the Bonds which shall have become due (other than Bonds called for redemption for the payment of which moneys are held pursuant to the provisions of this Indenture), in the order of their due dates, with interest on such Bonds from the respective dates upon which they become due, and if the amount available shall not be sufficient to pay in full Bonds due on any particular date, together with such interest, then to the payment ratably, to the amount of principal due on such date, to the persons entitled thereto without any discrimination or privilege; and

Third: To the payment of the balance, if any, to the Company or its successors or assigns, upon the written request of the Company, except for any remaining TIF Revenues which shall be paid to the Issuer, or to whosoever may be lawfully entitled to receive the same upon its written request, or as any court of competent jurisdiction may direct.

(b) If the principal of all the Bonds shall have become due or shall have been declared due and payable, all such moneys shall be applied to the payment of the principal and interest then due and unpaid upon the Bonds, without preference or priority of principal over interest or of

interest over any other installment of interest, according to the amounts due, respectively, for principal and interest, to the persons entitled thereto without any discrimination or privilege.

(c) If the principal of all the Bonds shall have been declared due and payable, and if such declaration shall thereafter have been rescinded and annulled under the provisions of this Article then, subject to the provisions of subsection (b) of this Section in the event that the principal of all the Bonds shall later become due or be declared due and payable, the moneys shall be applied in accordance with the provisions of subsection (a) of this Section.

Whenever moneys are to be applied pursuant to the provisions of this Section, such moneys shall be applied at such times, and from time to time, as the Trustee shall determine, having due regard to the amount of such moneys available for application and the likelihood of additional moneys becoming available for such application in the future. Whenever the Trustee shall apply such funds, it shall fix the date (which shall be an interest payment date unless it shall deem another date more suitable) upon which such application is to be made and upon such date interest on the amounts of principal to be paid on such dates shall cease to accrue. The Trustee shall give such notice as it may deem appropriate of the deposit with it of any such moneys and of the fixing of any such date and shall not be required to make payment to the holder of any Bond until such Bond shall be presented to the Trustee for appropriate endorsement or for cancellation if fully paid.

Section 7.6. Remedies Vested In Trustee. All rights of action (including the right to file proof of claims) under this Indenture or under any of the Bonds may be enforced by the Trustee without the possession of any of the Bonds or the production thereof in any trial or other proceedings relating thereto, and any such suit or proceeding instituted by the Trustee shall be brought in its name as Trustee without the necessity of joining as plaintiffs or defendants any holders of the Bonds, and any recovery of judgment shall, subject to the provisions of Section 7.4 hereof, be for the equal benefit of the holders of the outstanding Bonds.

Section 7.7. Rights and Remedies of Bondholders. No holder of any Bond shall have any right to institute any suit, action or proceeding in equity or at law for the enforcement of this Indenture or for the execution of any trust thereof or for the appointment of a receiver or any other remedy hereunder, unless a default has occurred of which the Trustee has been notified as provided in subsection (g) of Section 8.1, or of which by said subsection it is deemed to have notice, nor unless also such default shall have become an event of default and the holders of all Bonds then outstanding shall have made written request to the Trustee and shall have offered reasonable opportunity either to proceed to exercise the powers hereinbefore granted or to institute such action, suit or proceeding in its own name, nor unless also they have offered to the Trustee indemnity as provided in Section 8.1 hereof, nor unless the Trustee shall thereafter fail or refuse to exercise the powers hereinbefore granted, or to institute such action, suit or proceeding in its, his, or their own name or names. Such notification, request and offer of indemnity are hereby declared in every case at the option of the Trustee to be conditions precedent to the execution of the powers and trusts of this Indenture, and to any action or cause of action for the enforcement of this Indenture, or for the appointment of a receiver or for any other remedy hereunder; it being understood and intended that no one or more holders of the Bonds shall have any right in any manner whatsoever to affect, disturb or prejudice the lien of this Indenture by its, his or their action or to enforce any right hereunder except in the manner herein provided, and that all proceedings at law or in equity shall be instituted, had and maintained in the manner herein provided and for

the equal benefit of the holders of all Bonds then outstanding. Nothing in this Indenture contained shall, however, affect or impair the right of any Bondholder to enforce the covenants of the Issuer to pay the principal of and interest on each of the Bonds issued hereunder to the respective holders thereof at the time, place, from the source and in the manner in the Bonds expressed.

Section 7.8. Termination of Proceedings. In case the Trustee shall have proceeded to enforce any right under this Indenture by the appointment of a receiver, or otherwise, and such proceedings shall have been discontinued or abandoned for any reason, or shall have been determined adversely, then and in every such case the Issuer, the Company and the Trustee shall be restored to their former positions and rights hereunder, respectively, with respect to the Trust Estate, and all rights, remedies and powers of the Trustee shall continue as if no such proceedings had been taken.

Section 7.9. Waivers of Events of Default. The Trustee may in its discretion waive any event of default hereunder and its consequences and rescind any declaration of maturity of principal of and interest on the Bonds, and shall do so upon the written request of the holders of (1) all the Bonds then outstanding in respect of which default in the payment of principal and/or premium, if any, and/or interest exists, or (2) all Bonds then outstanding in the case of any other default; provided, however, that there shall not be waived (a) any event of default in the payment of the principal of any outstanding Bonds at the date of maturity specified therein, or (b) any default in the payment when due of the interest on any such Bonds unless prior to such waiver or rescission, arrears of interest, with interest (to the extent permitted by law) at the rate borne by the Bonds in respect of which such default shall have occurred on overdue installments of interest or all arrears of payments of principal and premium, if any, when due, as the case may be, and all expenses of the Trustee in connection with such default shall have been paid or provided for, and in case of any such waiver or rescission, or in case any proceeding taken by the Trustee on account of any such default shall have been discontinued or abandoned or determined adversely, then and in every such case the Issuer, the Trustee and the Bondholders shall be restored to their former positions and rights hereunder, respectively, but no such waiver or rescission shall extend to any subsequent or other default, or impair any right consequent thereon.

(End of Article VII)

## ARTICLE VIII.

### THE TRUSTEE AND PAYING AGENT

Section 8.1. Acceptance of the Trusts. The Trustee hereby accepts the trusts imposed upon it by this Indenture and agrees to perform said trusts as a corporate trustee ordinarily would perform said trusts under a corporate indenture, but no implied covenants or obligations shall be read into this Indenture against the Trustee.

(a) The Trustee may execute any of the trusts or powers hereof and perform any of its duties by or if appointed through attorneys, agents, receivers or employees but shall not be answerable for the conduct of the same if appointed with due care, and shall be entitled to advice of counsel concerning all matters of trusts hereof and the duties hereunder, and may in all cases pay such reasonable compensation to all such attorneys, agents, receivers and employees as may reasonably be employed in connection with the trusts hereof. The Trustee may act upon the opinion or advice of any attorney (who may be the attorney or attorneys for the Issuer or the Company). The Trustee shall not be responsible for any loss or damage resulting from any action or non-action in good faith in reliance upon such opinion or advice.

(b) The Trustee shall not be responsible for any recital herein, or in the Bonds (except in respect to the certificate of the Trustee endorsed on the Bonds), or for insuring the property herein conveyed or collecting any insurance moneys, or for the validity of the execution by the Issuer of this Indenture or of any supplements thereto or instruments of further assurance, or for the sufficiency of the security for the Bonds issued hereunder or intended to be secured hereby, or for the value or title of the property herein conveyed or otherwise as to the maintenance of the security hereof; and the Trustee shall not be bound to ascertain or inquire as to the performance or observance of any covenants, conditions or agreements on the part of the Issuer or on the part of the Company under the Financing Agreement; but the Trustee may require of the Issuer or the Company full information and advice as to the performance of the covenants, conditions and agreements aforesaid as to the condition of the property herein conveyed. The Trustee shall have no obligation to perform any of the duties of the Issuer under the Financing Agreement, and the Trustee shall not be responsible or liable for any loss suffered in connection with any investment of funds made by it in accordance with the provisions of this Indenture.

(c) The Trustee shall not be accountable for the use of any Bonds authenticated by it or the Paying Agent or delivered hereunder. The Trustee may become the owner of Bonds secured hereby with the same rights which it would have if not Trustee.

(d) The Trustee shall be protected in acting upon any notice, request, consent, certificate, order, affidavit, letter, telegram or other paper or document believed to be genuine and correct and to have been signed or sent by the proper person or persons. Any action taken by the Trustee pursuant to this Indenture upon the request or authority or consent of any person who at the time of making such request or giving such authority or consent is the owner of any Bond, shall be conclusive and binding upon all future owners of the same Bond and upon Bonds issued in exchange therefor or in place thereof.

(e) As to the existence or non-existence of any fact or as to the sufficiency or validity of any instrument, paper or proceeding, the Trustee shall be entitled to rely upon a certificate signed on behalf of the Issuer or the Company by its duly authorized officers as sufficient evidence of the facts therein contained and prior to the occurrence of a default of which the Trustee has been notified as provided in subsection (g) of this Section, or of which said subsection it is deemed to have notice, shall also be at liberty to accept a similar certificate to the effect that any particular dealing, transaction or action is necessary or expedient, but may at its discretion secure such further evidence deemed necessary or advisable, but shall in no case be bound to secure the same. The Trustee may accept a certificate of the Issuer or the Company under its seal to the effect that an ordinance or resolution in the form therein set forth has been adopted by the Issuer or the Company as conclusive evidence that such ordinance or resolution has been duly adopted and is in full force and effect.

(f) The permissive right of the Trustee to do things enumerated in this Indenture shall not be construed as a duty, and the Trustee shall not be answerable for other than its gross negligence or willful misconduct; provided, however, that the provisions of this subsection shall not affect the duties of the Trustee hereunder, including the provisions of Article VII hereof.

(g) The Trustee shall not be required to take notice or be deemed to have notice of any event of default hereunder (other than payment of the principal and interest on the Bonds) unless the Trustee shall be specifically notified in writing of such default by the Issuer or by the holders of at least twenty-five percent (25%) in aggregate principal amount of all Bonds then outstanding and all notices or other instruments required by this Indenture to be delivered to the Trustee must, in order to be effective, be delivered at the principal corporate trust office of the Trustee, and in the absence of such notice so delivered, the Trustee may conclusively assume there is no default except as aforesaid.

(h) The Trustee shall not be personally liable for any debts contracted or for damages to persons or to personal property injured or damaged, or for salaries or nonfulfillment of contracts during any period in which it may be in possession of or managing the Trust Estate.

(i) At any and all reasonable times and upon reasonable prior written notice, the Trustee, and its duly authorized agents, attorneys, experts, engineers, accountants and representatives, shall have the right fully to inspect the Trust Estate, and to take such memoranda from and in regard thereto as may be desired.

(j) The Trustee shall not be required to give any bond or surety in respect of the execution of the said trusts and powers or otherwise in respect of the premises.

(k) Notwithstanding anything elsewhere in this Indenture contained, the Trustee shall have the right, but shall not be required, to demand, in respect of the authentication of any Bonds, the withdrawal of any cash, the release of any property, or any action whatsoever within the purview of this Indenture, any showings, certificates, opinions, appraisals or other information, or corporate action or evidence thereof, in addition to that by the terms hereof required as a condition of such action by the Trustee, deemed desirable for the authentication of any Bonds, the withdrawal of any cash, or the taking of any other action by the Trustee.

(l) Before taking any action under this Section 8.1 the Trustee may require that a satisfactory indemnity bond be furnished for the reimbursement of all expenses to which it may be put and to protect it against all liability, except liability which is adjudicated to have resulted from its gross negligence or willful misconduct in connection with any action so taken. Such indemnity shall survive the termination of this Indenture.

(m) All moneys received by the Trustee or the Paying Agent shall, until used or applied or invested as herein provided, be held in trust for the purposes for which they were received but need not be segregated from other funds except to the extent required by law. Neither the Trustee nor the Paying Agent shall be under any liability for interest on any moneys received hereunder except such as may be agreed upon.

(n) The Trustee, prior to the occurrence of an event of default and after the curing of all events of default which may have occurred, undertakes to perform such duties and only such duties as are specifically set forth in this Indenture, and no implied covenants or obligations should be read into this Indenture against the Trustee. If any event of default under this Indenture shall have occurred and be continuing, the Trustee shall exercise such of the rights and powers vested in it by this Indenture and shall use the same degree of care as a prudent man would exercise or use in the circumstances in the conduct of his own affairs.

(o) The Trustee shall have no responsibility with respect to any information, statement or recital in any official statement, offering memorandum or any other disclosure material prepared or distributed with respect to the Bonds, except for any information provided by the Trustee, and shall have no responsibility for compliance with any state or federal securities laws in connection with the Bonds.

(p) The Trustee shall have the right to accept and act upon instructions, including funds transfer instructions ("Instructions") given pursuant to this Indenture and delivered using Electronic Means; provided, however, that the Issuer and Company shall provide to the Trustee an incumbency certificate listing officer with the authority to provide such Instructions ("Authorized Officers") and containing specimen signature of such Authorized Officer, which incumbency certificate shall be amended by the Issuer and Company whenever a person is to be added or deleted from the listing. If the Issuer and Company elects to give the Trustee Instructions using Electronic Means and the Trustee in its discretion elects to act upon such Instructions, the Trustee's understanding of such Instructions shall be deemed controlling. The Issuer and Company understands and agrees that the Trustee cannot determine the identity of the actual sender of such instructions and that the Trustee shall conclusively presume that direction that purport to have been sent by an Authorized Officer listed on the incumbency certificate provided to the Trustee have been sent by such Authorized Officer. The Issuer and Company shall be responsible for ensuring that only Authorized Officer transmit such instructions to the Trustee and that the Issuer and Company and all Authorized Officer are solely responsible to safeguard that use and confidentiality of applicable user and authorization codes, passwords and/or authentication keys upon receipt by the Issuer and Company. The Trustee shall not be liable for any losses, costs or expenses arising directly or indirectly from the Trustee's reliance upon and compliance with such Instructions notwithstanding such directions conflict or are inconsistent with a subsequent written Instruction. The Issuer and Company agrees: (i) to assume all risks arising out of the use of Electronic Means to submit Instructions to the Trustee, including without limitation the risk of the

Trustee acting on unauthorized Instructions, and the risk of interception and misuse by third parties; (ii) that it is fully informed of the protections and risks associated with the various methods of transmitting Instructions to the Trustee and that there may be more secure methods of transmitting Instructions that the method(s) selected by the Issuer and Company; (iii) that the security procedures (if any) to be followed in connection with its transmission of Instructions provide to it a commercially reasonable degree of protection in light of its particular needs and circumstances; and (iv) to notify the Trustee immediately upon learning of any compromise or unauthorized use of the security procedures. "Electronic Means" shall mean the following communications methods: e-mail, facsimile transmission, secure electronic transmission containing applicable authorization codes, passwords and/or authentication keys issued by the Trustee, or another method or system specified by the Trustee as available for use in connection with its services hereunder.

(q) The Trustee shall not be accountable for the use or application by the Issuer or Company of any of the Bonds or the proceeds thereof or for the use or application of any money paid over by the Trustee in accordance with the provisions of this Indenture or the Financing Agreement or for the use and application of money received by any paying agent.

(r) None of the provisions of this Indenture shall require the Trustee to expend or risk its own funds or otherwise incur any liability, financial or otherwise, in the performance of any of its duties hereunder, or in the exercise of any of its rights or powers, if it shall have reasonable grounds for believing that repayment of such funds or adequate indemnity against such risk or liability is not reasonable assured to it.

(s) The Trustee shall have no duty to review or analyze financial statements and shall hold such financial statements solely as a repository for the benefit of the Bondholders; the Trustee shall not be deemed to have notice of any information contained therein or event of default which may be disclosed therein in any manner.

Section 8.2. Fees, Charges and Expenses of Trustee and Paying Agent. The Trustee and Paying Agent shall be entitled to payment and/or reimbursement for reasonable fees for its services rendered hereunder and all advances, counsel fees and other expenses reasonably and necessarily made or incurred by the Trustee or Paying Agent in connection with such services. Such fees and expenses shall be payable upon the receipt of TIF Revenues received from the Issuer. In the event such TIF Revenues are insufficient to pay such fees and expenses of the Trustee, the Company shall be responsible for payment of said fees and expenses of the Trustee. Upon an event of default, but only upon an event of default, the Trustee shall have a right of payment prior to payment on account of interest or principal of, or premium, if any, on any Bond for the foregoing advances, fees, costs and expenses incurred. In the event of bankruptcy of the Issuer or Company, any fees and expenses of the Trustee shall constitute administrative expenses. If the Trustee renders any service hereunder not provided for in the Indenture, or the Trustee is made a party to or intervenes in any litigation pertaining to this Indenture or institutes interpleader proceedings relative hereto, the Trustee shall be compensated reasonable by the Issuer for such extraordinary services and reimbursed for any and all claims, liabilities, losses, damages, fines, penalties and expenses, including out-of-pocket and incidental expenses and legal fees occasioned thereby.

Section 8.3. Notice to Bondholders if Default Occurs. If an event of default occurs of which the Trustee is by subsection (g) of Section 8.1 hereof required to take notice or if notice of an event of default be given as in said subsection (g) provided, then the Trustee shall give written notice thereof by first class, registered or certified mail to the last known holders of all Bonds then outstanding shown by the list of Bondholders required by the terms of this Indenture to be kept at the office of the Trustee.

Section 8.4. Intervention by Trustee. In any judicial proceeding to which the Issuer is a party and which in the opinion of the Trustee and its counsel has a substantial bearing on the interests of holders of the Bonds, the Trustee may intervene on behalf of Bondholders and, subject to the provisions of Section 8.1(l), shall do so if requested in writing by the owners of at least twenty-five percent (25%) in aggregate principal amount of all Bonds then outstanding. The rights and obligations of the Trustee under this Section are subject to the approval of a court of competent jurisdiction.

Section 8.5. Successor Trustee. Any corporation or association into which the Trustee may be converted or merged, or with which it may be consolidated, or to which it may sell or transfer its corporate trust business and assets as a whole or substantially as a whole, or any corporation or association resulting from any such conversion, sale, merger, consolidation or transfer to which it is a party, ipso facto, shall be and become successor Trustee hereunder and vested with all of the title to the whole property or trust estate and all the trusts, powers, discretions, immunities, privileges and all other matters as was its predecessor, without the execution or filing of any instrument or any further act, deed or conveyance on the part of any of the parties hereto, anything herein to the contrary notwithstanding.

Section 8.6. Resignation by the Trustee. The Trustee and any successor Trustee may at any time resign from the trusts hereby created by giving thirty days' written notice to the Issuer and the Company and by registered or certified mail to each registered owner of Bonds then outstanding and to each holder of Bonds as shown by the list of Bondholders required by this Indenture to be kept at the office of the Trustee, and such resignation shall take effect at the end of such thirty (30) days, or upon the earlier appointment of a successor Trustee by the Bondholders or by the Issuer. Such notice to the Issuer and the Company may be served personally or sent by registered or certified mail. If at the end of the 30 days' notice period a successor trustee has not been appointed, the Trustee shall have the right to petition a court of competent jurisdiction to appoint a successor trustee.

Section 8.7. Removal of the Trustee. The Trustee may be removed at any time by an instrument or concurrent instruments in writing delivered to the Trustee and to the Issuer and signed by all the Bondholders.

Section 8.8. Appointment of Successor Trustee by the Bondholders; Temporary Trustee. In case the Trustee hereunder shall resign or be removed, or be dissolved, or shall be in course of dissolution or liquidation, or otherwise become incapable of acting hereunder, or in case it shall be taken under control of any public officer or officers, or of a receiver appointed by a court, a successor may be appointed by the owners of a majority in aggregate principal amount of Bonds then outstanding, by an instrument or concurrent instruments in writing signed by such owners, or by their attorneys-in-fact, duly authorized; provided, nevertheless, that in case of such

vacancy, the Issuer, by an instrument executed by one of its duly authorized officers, may appoint a temporary Trustee to fill such vacancy until a successor Trustee shall be appointed by the Bondholders in the manner above provided; and any such temporary Trustee so appointed by the Issuer shall immediately and without further act be superseded by the Trustee so appointed by such Bondholders. Every such Trustee appointed pursuant to the provisions of this Section shall be a trust company or bank, having a reported capital and surplus of not less than One Hundred Million Dollars (\$100,000,000) if there be such an institution willing, qualified and able to accept the trust upon reasonable or customary terms.

Section 8.9. Concerning Any Successor Trustees. Every successor Trustee appointed hereunder shall execute, acknowledge and deliver to its predecessor and also to the Issuer and the Company an instrument in writing accepting such appointment hereunder, and thereupon such successor, without any further act, deed or conveyance, shall become fully vested with all the estates, properties, rights, powers, trusts, duties and obligations of its predecessor; but such predecessor shall, nevertheless, on the written request of the Issuer, or of its successor, execute and deliver an instrument transferring to such successor Trustee all the estates, properties, rights, powers and trusts of such predecessor hereunder; and every predecessor Trustee shall deliver all securities and moneys held by it as Trustee hereunder to its successor. Should any instrument in writing from the Issuer be required by any successor Trustee for more fully and certainly vesting in such successor the estate, rights, powers and duties hereby vested or intended to be vested in the predecessor any and all such instruments in writing shall, on request, be executed, acknowledged and delivered by the Issuer. The resignation of any Trustee and the instrument or instruments removing any Trustee and appointing a successor hereunder, together with all other instruments provided for in this Article shall be filed by the successor Trustee in each office, if any, where the Indenture shall have been filed.

Section 8.10. Trustee Protected in Relying Upon Resolutions, etc. Subject to the conditions contained herein, the resolutions, ordinances, opinions, certificates and other instruments provided for in this Indenture may be accepted by the Trustee as conclusive evidence of the facts and conclusions stated therein and shall be full warrant, protection and authority to the Trustee for the release of property and the withdrawal of cash hereunder.

Section 8.11. Appointment of Paying Agent and Registrar; Resignation or Removal of Paying Agent. The Trustee is hereby appointed "Paying Agent" under this Indenture. Any Paying Agent may at any time resign and be discharged of the duties and obligations created by this instrument and any supplemental indenture by giving at least 60 days' written notice to the Issuer, the Company and the Trustee. Any Paying Agent may be removed at any time by an instrument, filed with such Paying Agent and the Trustee and signed by the Issuer and the Company. Any successor Paying Agent shall be appointed by the Issuer at the direction of the Company and shall be a bank or trust company duly organized under the laws of any state of the United States or a national banking association, in each case having a capital stock and surplus aggregating at least \$100,000,000, willing and able to accept the office on reasonable and customary terms and authorized by law to perform all the duties imposed upon it by this Indenture.

In the event of the resignation or removal of any Paying Agent, such Paying Agent shall pay over, assign and deliver any moneys or securities held by it as Paying Agent to its successors, or if there is no successor, to the Trustee.

Section 8.12 To the extent permitted by law, the Issuer hereby agrees to indemnify and save harmless the Trustee from all losses, liabilities, costs and expenses, including attorney fees and expenses, which may be incurred by it as a result of its acceptance of or arising from the performance of its duties hereunder unless such losses, liabilities, costs and expenses shall have been finally adjudicated to have resulted from the gross negligence or willful misconduct of the Trustee, and such indemnification shall survive its resignation or removal of the Trustee or the defeasance of this Indenture

(End of Article VIII)

## ARTICLE IX.

### SUPPLEMENTAL INDENTURES

Section 9.1. Supplemental Indentures Not Requiring Consent of Bondholders. Subject to the last sentence of this Section, the Issuer and the Trustee may without the consent of, or notice to, any of the Bondholders, enter into an indenture or indentures supplemental to this Indenture, as shall not be inconsistent with the terms and provisions hereof, for any one or more of the following purposes:

- (a) To cure any ambiguity or formal defect or omission in this Indenture;
- (b) To grant to or confer upon the Trustee for the benefit of the Bondholders any additional rights, remedies, powers or authority that may lawfully be granted to or conferred upon the Bondholders or the Trustee or any of them;
- (c) To subject to this Indenture additional security, revenues, properties or collateral;  
or
- (d) To make any other change in this Indenture which, in the judgment of the Trustee, is not to the material prejudice of the Trustee that is supported with an opinion of counsel that such action is not materially prejudicial to the holders, the Company, the Issuer or the holders of the Bonds; or
- (e) To modify, amend or supplement the Indenture in such manner as required to permit the qualification thereof under the Trust Indenture Act of 1939, as amended, or any similar Federal statute hereafter in effect, and, if they so determine, to add to the Indenture such other terms, conditions and provisions as may be required by said Trust Indenture Act of 1939, as amended, or similar federal statute.
- (f) To issue Additional Bonds in accordance with the provisions of Section 2.8 hereof.

Section 9.2. Supplemental Indentures Requiring Consent of Bondholders. Exclusive of supplemental indentures covered by Section 9.1 hereof, and subject to the terms and provisions contained in this Section, and not otherwise, the Requisite Bondholders shall have the right, from time to time, anything contained in this Indenture to the contrary notwithstanding, to consent to and approve the execution by the Issuer and the Trustee of such other indenture or indentures supplemental hereto as shall be deemed necessary and desirable by the Issuer for the purpose of modifying, altering, amending, adding to or rescinding, in any particular, any of the terms or provisions contained in this Indenture or in any supplemental indenture; provided however, that nothing in this section contained shall permit or be construed as permitting (except as otherwise permitted in this Indenture) (a) an extension of the stated maturity or reduction in the principal amount of, or reduction in the rate or extension of the time of paying of interest on, or reduction of any premium payable on the redemption of, any Bonds, without the consent of the holder of such Bond, or (b) a reduction in the amount or extension of the time of any payment required by any sinking fund applicable to any Bonds without the consent of the holders of all the Bonds which would be affected by the action to be taken, or (c) the creation of any lien prior to or on a parity with the lien of this Indenture without the consent of the holders of all the Bonds at the time

outstanding, or (d) a reduction in the aforesaid aggregate principal amount of Bonds the holders of which are required to consent to any such supplemental indenture, without the consent of the holders of all the Bonds at the time outstanding which would be affected by the action to be taken, or (e) a modification of the rights, duties or immunities of the Trustee, without the written consent of the Trustee, or (f) a privilege or priority of any Bond over any other Bonds, or (g) deprive the Owners of any Bonds then Outstanding of the lien thereby created.

Anything herein to the contrary notwithstanding, a supplemental indenture under this Article which affects any rights of the Company shall not become effective unless and until the Company shall have consented in writing to the execution and delivery of such supplemental indenture. In this regard, the Trustee shall cause notice of the proposed execution and delivery of any such supplemental indenture together with a copy of the proposed supplemental indenture to be mailed by certified or registered mail to the Company at least fifteen (15) days prior to the proposed date of execution and delivery of any such supplemental indenture.

The Trustee shall be entitled to receive, and shall be fully protected in relying upon, the opinion of any counsel approved by it who may be counsel for the Issuer, as conclusive evidence that any such proposed supplemental indenture complies with the provisions of this Indenture, and that it is proper for the Trustee, under the provisions of this Article, to join in the execution of such supplemental indenture. Costs of any such opinion shall be paid by the Issuer.

(End of Article IX)

## ARTICLE X.

### AMENDMENTS TO THE FINANCING AGREEMENT

Section 10.1. Amendments, etc., to Financing Agreement Not Requiring Consent of Bondholders. The Issuer and the Trustee with the consent of the Company shall, without the consent of or notice to the Bondholders, consent to any amendment, change or modification of the Financing Agreement as may be required by (i) the provisions of the Financing Agreement and this Indenture, or (ii) for the purpose of curing any ambiguity or formal defect or omission, or (iii) in connection with any other change therein which, in the judgment of the Trustee, is not to the material prejudice of the Trustee, the Issuer or the holders of the Bonds.

Section 10.2. Amendments, etc., to Financing Agreement Requiring Consent of Bondholders. Except for the amendments, changes or modifications as provided in Section 10.1 hereof, neither the Issuer nor the Trustee shall consent to any other amendment, change or modification of the Financing Agreement without the written approval or consent of the Requisite Bondholders given and procured as in Section 9.2 provided.

(End of Article X)

## ARTICLE XI.

### MISCELLANEOUS

Section 11.1. Satisfaction and Discharge. All rights and obligations of the Issuer and the Company under the Financing Agreement and this Indenture shall terminate, and such instruments shall cease to be of further effect, and the Trustee shall execute and deliver all appropriate instruments evidencing and acknowledging the satisfaction of this Indenture, and shall assign and deliver to the Company any moneys and investments in the Construction Fund and the Rebate Fund established hereunder (except moneys or investments held by the Trustee for the payment of principal of and interest on the Bonds and except for any TIF Revenues which shall be delivered to the Issuer) when:

- (a) all fees and expenses of the Trustee and the Paying Agent shall have been paid;
- (b) the Issuer and the Company shall have performed all of their covenants and promises in the Financing Agreement and in this Indenture; and
- (c) all Bonds theretofore authenticated and delivered (i) have become due and payable, or (ii) are to be retired or called for redemption under arrangements satisfactory to the Trustee for the giving of notice of redemption by the Trustee at the expense of the Company, or (iii) have been delivered to the Trustee canceled or for cancellation; and, in the case of (i) and (ii) above, there shall have been deposited with the Trustee either cash in an amount which shall be sufficient, or investments (but only to the extent that the full faith and credit of the United States of America are pledged to the timely payment thereof) the principal of and interest on which when due will provide moneys which, together with the moneys, if any, deposited with the Trustee, shall be sufficient, to pay when due the principal or redemption price, if applicable, and interest due and to become due on the Bonds prior to the redemption date or maturity date thereof, as the case may be. Provided, however, none of the Bonds may be advance refunded if such advance refunding is not permitted by the laws of Indiana.

Section 11.2. Defeasance of Bonds. Any Bond shall be deemed to be paid and no longer Outstanding within the meaning of this Article and for all purposes of this Indenture when (a) payment of the principal and interest of and premium, if any, on such Bond either (i) shall have been made or caused to be made in accordance with the terms thereof, or (ii) shall have been provided for by irrevocably depositing with the Trustee in trust and irrevocably set aside exclusively for such payment, (1) moneys sufficient to make such payment or (2) Governmental Obligations maturing as to principal and interest in such amounts and at such times as will insure the availability of sufficient moneys to make such payment, and (b) all necessary and proper fees, compensation, indemnities and expenses of the Trustee and the Issuer pertaining to the Bonds with respect to which such deposit is made shall have been paid or the payment thereof provided for. At such time as a Bond shall be deemed to be paid hereunder, as aforesaid, such Bond shall no longer be secured by or entitled to the benefits of this Indenture, except for the purposes of any such payment from such moneys or Governmental Obligations. The Trustee shall be entitled to receive a verification report of an independent certified public accountant, verification agent or similar expert to the effect that such securities and/or cash, together with the earnings thereon, will be sufficient to pay interest and principal (and applicable premium) on the Bonds to redemption or

maturity or an opinion of counsel to the effect that all conditions precedent to the defeasance have been complied with.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, no deposit under clause (a)(ii) of the immediately preceding paragraph shall be deemed payment of such Bonds as aforesaid until (a) proper notice of redemption of such Bonds shall have been previously given in accordance with Section 5.2 of this Indenture, or if the Bonds are not by their terms subject to redemption within the next succeeding sixty (60) days, until the Company shall have given the Trustee in form satisfactory to the Trustee irrevocable instructions to notify, as soon as practicable, the Owners of the Bonds, that the deposit required by the preceding paragraph has been made with the Trustee and that the Bonds are deemed to have been paid in accordance with this Section 11.2 and stating the maturity or redemption date upon which moneys are to be available for the payment of the principal of and the applicable redemption premium, if any, on the Bonds, plus interest thereon to the due date thereof; or (b) the maturity of such Bonds.

All moneys so deposited with the Trustee as provided in this Section 11.2 may also be invested and reinvested, at the written direction of the Company, in Governmental Obligations, maturing in the amounts and at the times as hereinbefore set forth, and all income from all Governmental Obligations in the hands of the Trustee pursuant to this Section 11.2 which is not required for the payment of principal of the Bonds and interest on and premium, if any, thereon with respect to which such moneys shall have been so deposited shall be deposited in the Bond Fund as and when realized and collected for use and application as are other moneys deposited in the Bond Fund.

Notwithstanding any provision of any other Article of this Indenture which may be contrary to the provisions of this Section 11.2, all moneys or Governmental Obligations set aside and held in trust pursuant to the provisions of this Section 11.2 for the payment of Bonds (including premium thereon, if any) shall be applied to and used solely for the payment of the particular Bonds (including the premium thereon, if any) with respect to which such moneys or Governmental Obligations have been so set aside in trust.

Anything in Article 9 hereof to the contrary notwithstanding, if moneys or Governmental obligations have been deposited or set aside with the Trustee pursuant to this Section 11.2 for the payment of Bonds and such Bonds shall not have in fact been actually paid in full, no amendment to the provisions of this Section 11.2 shall be made without the consent of the Owner of each Bond affected thereby.

The right to register the transfer of or to exchange Bonds shall survive the discharge of this Indenture.

Section 11.3. Cancellation of Bonds. If the Owner of any Series 2023 Bonds presents that Series 2023 Bond to the Trustee with an instrument satisfactory to the Trustee waiving all claims for payment of that Series 2023 Bond, the Trustee shall cancel that Series 2023 Bond and the Bondholder shall have no further claim against the Trust Estate, the Issuer or the Company with respect to that Series 2023 Bond.

Section 11.4. Application of Trust Money. All money or investments deposited with or held by the Trustee pursuant to Section 11.1 shall be held in trust for the holders of the Bonds, and applied by it, in accordance with the provisions of the Bonds and this Indenture, to the payment, either directly or through the Paying Agent, to the persons entitled thereto, of the principal (and premium, if any) and interest for whose payment such money has been deposited with the Trustee; but such money or obligations need not be segregated from other funds except to the extent required by law.

Section 11.5. Consents, etc., of Bondholders. Any consent, request, direction, approval, objection or other instrument required by this Indenture to be executed by the Bondholders may be in any number of concurrent writings of similar tenor and may be executed by such Bondholders in person or by agent appointed in writing. Provided, however, that wherever this Indenture or the Financing Agreement requires that any such consent or other action be taken by the holders of a specified percentage, fraction or majority of the Bonds outstanding, any such Bonds held by or for the account of the following persons shall not be deemed to be outstanding hereunder for the purpose of determining whether such requirement has been met: the Issuer or any of its members. For all other purposes, Bonds held by or for the account of such person shall be deemed to be outstanding hereunder. Proof of the execution of any such consent, request, direction, approval, objection or other instrument or of the writing appointing any such agent and of the ownership of Bonds, if made in the following manner, shall be sufficient for any of the purposes of this Indenture, and shall be conclusive in favor of the Trustee with regard to any action taken under such request or other instrument, namely:

(a) The fact and date of the execution by any person of any such writing may be proved by the certificate of any officer in any jurisdiction who by law has power to take acknowledgments within such jurisdiction that the person signing such writing acknowledged before him the execution thereof, or by affidavit of any witness to such execution.

(b) The fact of the holding by any person of Bonds transferable by assignment and the amounts and numbers of such Bonds, and the date of the holding of the same, may be proved by a certificate executed by any trust company, bank or bankers, wherever situated, stating that at the date thereof the party named therein did exhibit to an officer of such trust company or bank or to such banker, as the property of such party, the Bonds therein mentioned if such certificate shall be deemed by the Trustee to be satisfactory. The Trustee may, in its discretion, require evidence that such Bonds have been deposited with a bank, bankers or trust company, before taking any action based on such ownership. In lieu of the foregoing, the Trustee may accept other proofs of the foregoing as it shall deem appropriate.

For all purposes of this Indenture and of the proceedings for the enforcement hereof, such person shall be deemed to continue to be the holder of such Bond until the Trustee shall have received notice in writing to the contrary.

Section 11.6. Limitation of Rights. With the exception of rights herein expressly conferred, nothing expressed or mentioned in or to be implied from this Indenture, or the Bonds is intended or shall be construed to give to any person other than the parties hereto, and the Company, and the holders of the Bonds, any legal or equitable right, remedy or claim under or in respect to this Indenture or any covenants, conditions and provisions herein contained, this Indenture and all

of the covenants, conditions and provisions hereof being intended to be and being for the sole and exclusive benefit of the parties hereto and the Company and the holders of the Bonds as herein provided.

Section 11.7. Severability. If any provision of this Indenture shall be held or deemed to be or shall, in fact, be inoperative or unenforceable as applied in any particular case in any jurisdiction or jurisdictions or in all jurisdictions, or in all cases because it conflicts with any other provision or provisions hereof or any constitution or statute or rule of public policy, or for any other reason, such circumstances shall not have the effect of rendering the provision in question inoperative or unenforceable in any other case or circumstance, or of rendering any other provision or provisions herein contained invalid, inoperative, or unenforceable to any extent whatever.

The invalidity of any one or more phrases, sentences, clauses or Sections in this Indenture contained, shall not affect the remaining portions of this Indenture, or any part thereof.

Section 11.8. Notices. All notices, demands, certificates or other communications hereunder shall be sufficiently given and shall be deemed given when mailed by first class, registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, with proper address as indicated below. The Issuer, the Company, and the Trustee may, by written notice given by each to the others, designate any address or addresses to which notices, demands, certificates or other communications to them shall be sent when required as contemplated by this Indenture. Until otherwise provided by the respective parties, all notices, demands, certificates and communications to each of them shall be addressed as provided in Section 9.4 of the Financing Agreement.

Section 11.9. Counterparts. This Indenture may be simultaneously executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original and all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.

Section 11.10. Applicable Law. This Indenture shall be governed exclusively by the applicable laws of the State of Indiana.

Section 11.11. Immunity of Officers and Directors. No recourse shall be had for the payment of the principal of or premium or interest on any of the Bonds or for any claim based thereon or upon any obligation, covenant or agreement in this Indenture contained against any past, present or future members, officer, directors, agents, attorneys or employees of the Issuer, or any incorporator, member, officer, director, agents, attorneys, employees or trustee of any successor corporation, as such, either directly or through the Issuer or any successor corporation, under any rule of law or equity, statute or constitution or by the enforcement of any assessment or penalty or otherwise, and all such liability of any such incorporator, members, officers, directors, agents, attorneys, employees or trustees as such is hereby expressly waived and released as a condition of and consideration for the execution of this Indenture and issuance of such Bonds.

Section 11.12. Holidays. If any date for the payment of principal or interest on the Bonds is not a business day then such payment shall be due on the first business day thereafter.

Section 11.13. Shortfall of TIF Revenues. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Indenture, any portion of the principal or interest due on the Series 2023 Bonds that remains unpaid due to a shortfall in TIF Revenues shall not be deemed defeased or otherwise satisfied, shall not

be considered paid, and shall continue to be due and owing until the earlier of: (i) full payment by the Issuer; or (ii) the date which is 25 years after the date on which the Series 2023 Bonds are issued.

Indiana Code, Title 36, Article 7, Chapters 11.9, -12, -14 and -25 (collectively, "Act") has been enacted by the General Assembly of Indiana.

The Act provides that an Issuer may, pursuant to the Act, issue revenue bonds for the purpose of financing costs of economic development facilities, for diversification of industry and the development and promotion of job opportunities in or near the City and vests the City with powers that may be necessary to enable it to accomplish such purposes.

The Goshen Redevelopment Commission ("Redevelopment Commission") has created, consolidated and enlarged the Consolidated River Race/US 33 Economic Development Area ("Area"), and an allocation area coterminous with the Area known as the Consolidated River Race/US 33 Allocation Area ("Original Allocation Area") in accordance with IC 36-7-14-39 for the purpose of capturing real property taxes generated from the incremental assessed value of real property located in the Original Allocation Area, and adopted an economic development plan, as amended (collectively, "Original Plan"), which Original Plan contained specific recommendations for economic development in the Area, pursuant to Declaratory Resolution No. 02-2012 (as amended to date), as confirmed by Confirmatory Resolution No. 26-2012 (as amended to date), after public hearings (collectively, "Area Resolution").

The Area Resolution established three allocation areas, including the 9<sup>th</sup> Street Corridor Allocation Area ("Allocation Area") in accordance with IC 36-7-14-39, for the purpose of capturing property taxes generated from the incremental assessed value of real property located in the Allocation Area ("Tax Increment");

The Issuer, upon finding that the Projects needed to support the Facility (each as hereinafter defined) and the proposed financing of the construction thereof will induce the Company to create additional employment opportunities in the City of Goshen, Indiana ("City"); assist the City with the existing housing shortage; will benefit the health, safety, morals, and general welfare of the citizens of the City and the State of Indiana; and will comply with the purposes and provisions of the Act, the Issuer adopted an ordinance approving the proposed financing.

The Issuer intends to issue its [Taxable] Economic Development Revenue Bonds, Series 2023 (Ariel Project) ("Series 2023 Bonds") in the aggregate principal amount of \$ \_\_\_\_\_ pursuant to the Trust Indenture dated as of \_\_\_\_\_ 1, 2023 ("Indenture") between the Issuer and \_\_\_\_\_ as Trustee ("Trustee") and intends to utilize the proceeds of the Series 2023 Bonds pursuant to the provisions of this Financing Agreement to finance the construction of infrastructure improvements, including but not limited to water, sewer,

stormwater, electric and road improvements, including sidewalks, demolition, and the construction of footers and slabs associated with multi-family residential units assessed as commercial property, together with all necessary appurtenances and related improvements needed to serve the Facility as further set forth in Exhibit B to the Area Resolution (collectively, "Projects") in or physically connected to the Allocation Area and to pay issuance costs to induce the Company to construct the Facility.

This Financing Agreement provides for the payment by the Commission of the Series 2023 Bonds from TIF Revenues.

Subject to the further provisions of this Financing Agreement, the Series 2023 Bonds will be payable solely out of TIF Revenues, Bond proceeds (less costs of issuance) and Net Proceeds.

In consideration of the premises, the use of the proceeds of the Series 2023 Bonds and of other good and valuable consideration, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the Company has executed and delivered this Financing Agreement.

The Company and the Issuer hereby covenant and agree as follows:

## ARTICLE I.

### DEFINITIONS AND EXHIBITS

Section 1.1. Terms Defined. As used in this Financing Agreement, the following terms shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly otherwise requires:

"Act" means, collectively, Indiana Code 36-7-11.9, -12, -14 and -25 and any successor provisions of the Indiana Code or successor codes.

"Allocation Area" means the 9<sup>th</sup> Street Corridor Allocation Area.

"Annual Fees" means annual fees of the Trustee and reasonable (in an amount not to exceed \$5,000) annual fees and expenses incurred by the Issuer related to monitoring Tax Increment.

"Area" means the Consolidated River Race/US 33 Economic Development Area.

"Authorized Representative" means: (i) as to the Company, any officer of the Company or any other person certified by an officer of the Company to be such, and shall serve as Authorized Representative for the Company; and (ii) as to the Issuer, any person so designated by the Mayor and authorized to serve as Authorized Representative for the Issuer.

"Bond Counsel" means a nationally recognized firm of municipal bond attorneys acceptable to the Trustee.

"Bond Fund" means the Bond Fund established by Section 4.2 of the Indenture.

"Bond Year" means each twelve-month period ending on any bond payment date.

"Bondholder" or any similar term means the registered owner of a Bond.

"Bonds" means the Series 2023 Bonds and any other bonds issued under the Indenture.

"Business Day" means any day other than a Saturday, Sunday or holiday on which commercial banks in the city or town in which the principal office of the Trustee is located are open for conducting substantially all of its banking activities.

"Commission" means the Goshen Economic Development Commission.

"Company" means AP Cycleworks LLC, a limited liability company duly organized, existing and authorized to do business under the laws of the State of Indiana, or any successors thereto permitted under Section 3.3 hereof.

"Completion Date" means the date of delivery by the Company to the Trustee of the certificate required by Section 4.4(c) of the Indenture, evidencing the completion of the Facility.

"Construction Fund" means the Construction Fund established in Section 4.4 of the Indenture.

"Costs of Construction" means the categorical costs of providing for an "economic development project" as defined and set forth in the Act as follows:

- (i) the "Bond Issuance Costs," namely the costs, fees and expenses incurred or to be incurred by the Issuer and Redevelopment Commission in connection with the issuance and sale of the Series 2023 Bonds, the fees and disbursements of Bond Counsel, fees of the Issuer or Redevelopment Commission's municipal advisor, the fees of the Issuer and Redevelopment Commission's counsel, the acceptance fee and first year annual administrative fee of the Trustee, application fees and expenses, publication costs, the filing and recording fees in connection with any filings or recording necessary under the Indenture, the out-of-pocket costs of the Issuer, the costs of preparing or printing the Series 2023 Bonds and the documentation supporting the issuance of the Series 2023 Bonds, the costs of reproducing documents, and any other costs of a similar nature reasonably incurred;
- (ii) the cost of insurance of all kinds that may be required or necessary in connection with the construction of the Projects;
- (iii) all costs and expenses which Issuer or Company shall be required to pay, under the terms of any contract or contracts (including the architectural and engineering and development) for materials and the construction of the Projects; and
- (iv) any sums required to reimburse the Issuer, Redevelopment Commission or Company for advances made by either of them for any of the above items or for any other costs incurred and for work done by either of them which are properly chargeable to the Projects.

"Development Agreement" means the Development Agreement dated April 27, 2022, as amended, among the City, the Redevelopment Commission and the Company.

"Facility" means the multi-family residential development as further set forth in the Development Agreement.

"Government Obligations" means direct obligations of, or obligations the timely payment of the principal of and the interest on which are fully and unconditionally guaranteed by, the United States of America.

"Indenture" means the Trust Indenture dated as of \_\_\_\_\_ 1, 2023, between the Issuer and the Trustee and all amendments and supplements thereto.

"Issuer" means the City of Goshen, Indiana, a municipal corporation and political subdivision duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the State.

"Net Proceeds," when used with respect to any insurance or condemnation award, means the gross proceeds from the insurance or condemnation award remaining after payment of all expenses (including attorneys' fees and expenses and any expenses of the Trustee or the Issuer) incurred in the collection of such gross proceeds.

"Outstanding" means Bonds which have been duly authenticated and delivered by the Trustee under the Indenture, except:

(i) Bonds canceled after purchase in the open market or because of payment at or redemption prior to maturity;

(ii) Bonds for the redemption of which cash or investments (but only to the extent that the full faith and credit of the United States of America are pledged to the timely payment thereof) shall have been theretofore deposited with the Trustee (whether upon or prior to the maturity or redemption date of any such Bonds); provided that if such Bonds are to be redeemed prior to the maturity thereof, notice of such redemption shall have been given or arrangements satisfactory to the Trustee shall have been made therefor, or waiver of such notice satisfactory in form to the Trustee, shall have been filed with the Trustee; and

(iii) Bonds in lieu of which others have been authenticated under Section 2.9 of the Indenture.

"Projects" means the construction of infrastructure improvements, including but not limited to, water, sewer, stormwater, electric and road improvements, including sidewalks, demolition, and the construction of footers and slabs associated with multi-family residential units assessed as commercial property, together with all necessary appurtenances and related improvements needed to serve the Facility, as further set forth in Exhibit B to the Area Resolution, in or physically connected to the Allocation Area.

"Purchaser" means Legacy Communities, Inc., a corporation duly organized, existing and authorized to do business under the laws of the State of Indiana.

"Qualified Investments" means any of the following classes of securities, to the extent to which investment in such securities is permitted under State law: (i) direct obligations of, or obligations the payment of the principal of and interest on which when due are unconditionally guaranteed by, the United States of America; (ii) bonds, debentures, participation certificates, or notes of any of the following agencies of the United States government: Federal Farm Credit Banks, the Federal National Mortgage Association, the Government National Mortgage Association, the Student Financing Marketing Corporation, the Federal Land Bank, the World Bank, the Resolution Trust Corporation, the Federal Home Financing Mortgage Corporation, and the Federal Home Financing Bank; (iii) investments which evidence direct ownership of future interest and principal payments of obligations described in (i) or (ii) above; (iv) mutual funds or money market funds (including an affiliate of the Trustee) which only invest in obligations described in (i), (ii), or (vii) herein and which are rated in the highest category by a national rating agency at the time of purchase; (v) unsecured interest-bearing obligations of any commercial bank (including the Trustee), trust company, bank holding company, insurance company, or any other entity with long-term debt obligations which have been assigned to a rating category no less than the second highest category assigned by Standard & Poor's Ratings Group and Moody's Investors Service at the time of purchase; (vi) deposits in interest-bearing time deposits or savings accounts in banks (including the Trustee) organized under the laws of any state of the United States or under the laws of the United States or in savings and financing associations organized under the laws of

any state of the United States or under the laws of the United States, provided that any such deposits are (x) insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation or (y) fully secured by obligations of the type specified in (i), (ii), (iii), or (v) above; and (vii) fully collateralized direct repurchase agreements or guaranteed investment contracts having a defined termination date, secured by obligations of the United States of America or its agencies and instrumentalities in market value of not less than the principal amount of the funds disbursed, pledged with a third party selected or approved by the Company, and placed through a primary government securities dealer, as defined by the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System, or a nationally or state chartered bank (which may include the Trustee).

"Redevelopment Commission" means the Goshen Redevelopment Commission.

"Series 2023 Bonds" or "Bonds" means the [Taxable] Economic Development Revenue Bonds, Series 2023 (Ariel Project) to be issued by the Issuer under the Indenture in the aggregate principal amount of \$ \_\_\_\_\_.

"State" means the State of Indiana.

"Tax Increment" means all property tax proceeds attributable to the assessed valuation of real property in the Allocation Area in excess of the assessed valuation described in IC 36-7-14-39(b)(1), as such statutory provision exists on the date of issuance of the Series 2023 Bonds. The incremental assessed value is multiplied by the then current property tax rate (per \$100 assessed value).

"TIF Pledge Resolution" means the resolution of the Redevelopment Commission adopted on \_\_\_\_\_, 2023, pledging TIF Revenues to the Issuer for the payment of debt service on the Series 2023 Bonds.

"TIF Revenues" means 100% of the Tax Increment generated in the Allocation Area and deposited into the Redevelopment Commission's Allocation Fund, minus the Annual Fees, received by the Redevelopment Commission and pledged to the Issuer for payment of the Bonds pursuant to the TIF Pledge Resolution.

"Trustee" means the trustee and/or co-trustee at the time serving as such under the Indenture and shall initially mean \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_, \_\_\_\_\_.

"Written Request" means a request in writing from an Authorized Representative of the party making the request.

Section 1.2. Rules of Interpretation. For all purposes of this Financing Agreement, except as otherwise expressly provided, or unless the context otherwise requires:

(a) "This Financing Agreement" means this instrument as originally executed and as it may from time to time be supplemented or amended pursuant to the applicable provisions hereof.

(b) All references in this instrument to designated "Articles," "Sections" and other subdivisions are to the designated Articles, Sections and other subdivisions of this

instrument as originally executed. The words "herein," "hereof" and "hereunder" and other words of similar import refer to this Financing Agreement as a whole and not to any particular Article, Section or other subdivision.

(c) The terms defined in this Article have the meanings assigned to them in this Article and include the plural as well as the singular and the singular as well as the plural.

(d) All accounting terms not otherwise defined herein have the meanings assigned to them in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles as consistently applied.

(e) Any terms not defined herein but defined in the Indenture shall have the same meaning herein.

(f) The terms defined elsewhere in this Financing Agreement shall have the meanings therein prescribed for them.

(End of Article I)

## ARTICLE II.

### REPRESENTATIONS

#### Section 2.1. Representations by Issuer. Issuer represents and warrants that:

(a) The Issuer is a municipal corporation duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the State. Under the provisions of the Act, the Issuer is authorized to enter into the transactions contemplated by this Financing Agreement and to carry out its obligations hereunder. The Issuer has been duly authorized to execute and deliver this Financing Agreement.

(b) The Issuer agrees to provide funds from the issuance of the Series 2023 Bonds for financing the costs associated with the construction of the Projects to induce the Company to construct the Facility, to the end that industry and the economy may be diversified, job opportunities promoted and housing provided.

(c) The Issuer covenants that it will timely pay the TIF Revenues to the Trustee as provided in the Indenture. The Issuer represents and warrants that the TIF Pledge Resolution of the Redevelopment Commission was validly adopted and constitutes a valid and binding obligation of the Issuer, enforceable against the Issuer in accordance with its terms.

#### Section 2.2. Representations by Company. Company represents and warrants that:

(a) The Company is a limited liability company duly organized and validly existing under the laws of the State of Indiana and authorized to do business in the State of Indiana, is not in violation of any laws in any manner material to its ability to perform its obligations under this Financing Agreement, has full power to enter into and perform its obligations under this Agreement, and by proper action has duly authorized the execution and delivery of this Financing Agreement.

(b) The execution and delivery of this Financing Agreement and the performance by the Company of its obligations under this Financing Agreement, (i) have been duly and effectively authorized by all necessary limited liability company action on the part of the Company, (ii) do not conflict with or result in any breach of any of the material terms, conditions or provisions of, or constitute a default under, or result in the creation or imposition of any material lien, charge or encumbrance upon any property or assets of the Company pursuant to any indenture, loan agreement or other agreement or instrument (other than this Financing Agreement to which the Company is a party or by which the Company, its properties or operations may be bound), and (iii) will not result in any material violation of the provisions of the by-laws or similar governing documents of the Company or any material laws, ordinances, governmental rules or regulations or court or other governmental orders to which the Company, its properties or operations are subject.

(c) The execution, delivery and performance by the Company of this Financing Agreement does not require the consent or approval of, the giving of notice to, the registration with, or the taking of any other action in respect of, any federal, state or other governmental authority or agency, not previously obtained or performed.

(d) Assuming the due authorization, execution and delivery thereof by the other parties thereto, this Financing Agreement has been duly executed and delivered by the Company and constitutes the legal, valid and binding agreement of the Company, enforceable against the Company in accordance with its terms, except as may be limited by bankruptcy, insolvency or other similar laws affecting the enforcement of creditors' rights in general.

(e) There are no actions, suits or proceedings pending, or, to the knowledge of the Company, threatened, before any court, administrative agency or arbitrator which, individually or in the aggregate, might result in any material adverse change in the financial condition of the Company or might impair the ability of the Company to perform its obligations under this Financing Agreement.

(f) To the Company's knowledge, no event has occurred and is continuing which with the lapse of time or the giving of notice would constitute an event of default under this Financing Agreement.

(g) The Company expects to complete construction of the Facility by June 1, 2025, subject to Section 3.9 hereof.

(h) The Company expects the total investment in the Facility will be approximately Thirty Million Dollars (\$30,000,000).

(i) To the extent permissible by applicable laws, rules and regulations, the Company will offer 20% of the residential units within the Facility to persons employed as first responders, health care workers and teachers as more fully described in Section 4.04 of the Economic Development Agreement.

(j) The Company will comply with construction material, quality and aesthetic standards as required by current local ordinances and will submit to the City Plan Commission for approval of the detailed plans for the Facility.

Section 2.3. Financing of Series 2023 Bond Proceeds by Issuer. Concurrently with the execution and delivery hereof, the Issuer is issuing the Series 2023 Bonds and is providing the proceeds from the sale thereof to the Company by making the deposits and payments specified in Section 3.1 and 4.6 of the Indenture.

## ARTICLE III.

### PARTICULAR COVENANTS OF THE COMPANY AND THE ISSUER

Section 3.1. Consent to Assignments to Trustee. The Company acknowledges and consents to the assignment of the Issuer's rights hereunder to the Trustee pursuant to the Indenture and agrees that the Trustee may enforce the rights, remedies and privileges granted to the Issuer hereunder and agrees to execute and deliver supplements and amendments to this Financing Agreement pursuant to Section 7.1 hereof.

Section 3.2. General Covenants. (a) The Company covenants and agrees with and for the express benefit of the Issuer, the Trustee and the owners of the Bonds that the Company shall perform all of its obligations, covenants and agreements hereunder, without notice or demand.

(b) Until such time as the construction of the Projects and Facility shall have been completed, the Company: (i) will perform and observe all of its agreements contained in this Financing Agreement; and (ii) will not terminate this Financing Agreement for any cause, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, failure of the Company to complete the Facility, the occurrence of any acts or circumstances that may constitute failure of consideration, eviction or constructive eviction, destruction of or damage to the Facility, commercial frustration of purpose, any change in the tax laws of the United States of America or of the State or any political subdivision of either thereof, or any failure of the Issuer or the Trustee to perform and observe any agreement, whether express or implied, or any duty, liability or obligation arising out of or connected with this Financing Agreement or the Indenture.

Section 3.3. Continuing Existence and Qualification; Assignment, Sale or Other Disposition of Projects. The Company covenants that until such time as the Series 2023 Bonds have been paid in full, it will maintain in good standing its corporate existence and qualification to do business in the State, will not dissolve or otherwise dispose of all or substantially all of its assets and will not consolidate with or merge into another entity or permit one or more other entities to consolidate with or merge into it; provided that the Company may, without violating its agreement contained in this Section, consolidate with or merge into another corporation or other entity, or permit one or more other corporations or other entities to consolidate with or merge into it, or sell or otherwise transfer to another corporation or entity all or substantially all of its assets as an entirety and thereafter dissolve, provided the surviving, resulting or transferee entity (such corporation being hereinafter called the "Surviving Corporation") (if other than the Company) expressly accepts, agrees and assumes in writing to pay and perform all of the obligations of the Company herein and be bound by all of the agreements of the Company contained in this Financing Agreement to the same extent as if the Surviving Corporation had originally executed this Financing Agreement, and the Surviving Corporation is an Indiana corporation or is a foreign corporation or partnership, trust or other person or entity organized under the laws of one of the states of the United States and is qualified to do business in the State of Indiana as a foreign corporation or partnership, trust or other person or entity.

Section 3.4. Company Duties Under Indenture. The Company agrees to perform all matters provided by the Indenture to be performed by the Company and to comply with all provisions of the Indenture to be complied with by the Company.

Section 3.5. Reserved.

Section 3.6. Trustee's Right to Perform Company's Covenants; Advances. Only if the owner of the Bonds is other than the Purchaser, if the Company shall fail to (i) complete or cause the completion of the construction and equipping of the Projects, or (ii) fail to make any payment or perform any other act required to be performed hereunder, then and in each such case the Trustee, upon not less than 30 days' prior written notice to the Company, may (but shall not be obligated to) remedy such default for the account of the Company and make advances for that purpose. No such performance or advance shall operate to release the Company from any such default, and any sums so advanced by the Trustee shall be repayable by the Company on demand and shall bear interest at the Trustee bank's prime rate plus two percent (2%) from the date of the advance until repaid.

Section 3.7. Indemnity. The Company will pay, protect, defend, indemnify and save the Issuer and the Trustee harmless from and against, all liabilities, losses, damages, costs, expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses of the Issuer and the Trustee), causes of actions, suits, claims, demands and judgments of any nature arising from a breach by the Company of any covenant, agreement, representation or warranty in this Financing Agreement (except with respect to any breach of any of Issuer's covenants, agreements, representations or warranties included in this Financing Agreement or which may be incurred by the Trustee as a result of its acceptance of or arising from the performance of its duties under the Indenture and except for damage resulting from willful or gross negligent actions by the Issuer and the Trustee).

The Company will pay, protect, defend, indemnify and save the Commission and the Redevelopment Commission harmless from and against, all liabilities, losses, damages, costs, expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees and expenses of the Commission and the Redevelopment Commission), causes of actions, suits, claims, demands and judgments of any nature to the extent arising from breach by the Company of any covenant, agreement, representation or warranty in this Financing Agreement (except with respect to any breach of any of Commission's or Redevelopment Commission's covenants, agreements, representations or warranties included in this Financing Agreement and except for damage resulting from willful or negligent actions by the Commission or the Redevelopment Commission).

If any proceeding is instituted for which indemnity may be sought under this Section 3.7, the party that may seek such indemnity shall notify the Company and the Issuer in writing in a timely manner to allow the Company to defend any action or claim in such proceeding.

Section 3.8. Funding of Indenture Funds; Investments. The Issuer shall deposit with the Trustee proceeds from the sale of the Series 2023 Bonds in the manner specified in Article 3 of the Indenture, and the Trustee shall deposit such proceeds in the manner specified in such Article.

The Company and the Issuer agree that all moneys in any Fund established by the Indenture shall, at the written direction of the Company, be invested in Qualified Investments. In the absence of written investment direction from the Company, the Trustee shall not be responsible or liable for keeping the moneys held by it hereunder fully invested in Qualified Investments.

The Trustee is hereby authorized to trade with itself in the purchase and sale of securities for such investments, and may charge its ordinary and customary fees for such trades, including cash sweep account fees. The Trustee shall not be liable or responsible for any loss resulting from any such investment properly obtained in accordance with the Company's direction. All such investments shall be held by or under the control of the Trustee and any income resulting therefrom shall be applied in the manner specified in the Indenture. Although the Issuer and the Company each recognizes that it may obtain a broker confirmation or written statement containing comparable information at no additional cost, the Issuer and the Company hereby agree that confirmations of permitted investments are not required to be issued by the Trustee for each month in which a monthly statement is rendered. No statement need be rendered for any fund or account if no activity occurred in such fund or account during such month.

Section 3.9. Completion of Facility. (a) The Company agrees, subject to Force Majeure and other conditions or events beyond the Company's control, that it will use reasonable efforts to cause to be made, executed, acknowledged and delivered any contracts, orders, receipts, writings and instructions with any other persons, firms, corporations or partnerships and in general do all things which may be requisite or proper, all for constructing and completing the Facility by June 1, 2025.

The Company agrees, for the benefit of the Issuer and the Bondholders and in order to fulfill the purposes of the Act, to complete the construction of the Facility and to pay from other funds of the Company that portion of the costs of the Projects as may be in excess of the moneys available therefor in the Construction Fund. The Issuer does not make any warranty, either express or implied, that the moneys, which will be paid into the Construction Fund and which under the provisions of this Financing Agreement will be available for payment of the costs of the construction of the Projects, will be sufficient to pay all the costs which will be incurred in that connection.

The Issuer has, in Section 4.4 of the Indenture, authorized and directed Trustee to make payments from the Construction Fund to pay the Costs of Construction, or to reimburse Company or the Issuer for any Costs of Construction paid by it in the manner and subject to the provision of Section 4.4 thereof.

The Completion Date of the Projects shall be evidenced to Trustee by a certificate signed by an Authorized Representative of the Issuer in compliance with the provision of Section 4.4(c) of the Indenture and any excess proceeds in the Construction Fund at such time shall be deposited in the Bond Fund and used to prepay the Series 2023 Bonds as provided in Section 4.4(d) of the Indenture, provided, however that any failure to file such certificate shall not constitute an Event of Default under this Financing Agreement or the Indenture.

Section 3.10. Reserved.

ARTICLE IV.

APPLICATION OF SERIES 2023 BOND PROCEEDS

Section 4.1. Use of Series 2023 Bond Proceeds by Issuer. Concurrently with the execution and delivery hereof, the Issuer is issuing the Series 2023 Bonds and is depositing the proceeds from the sale thereof with the Trustee for use by making the deposits and payments specified in Section 3.1 and 4.4 of the Indenture; provided such proceeds shall be used solely in connection with the development of the Projects and advanced and used solely in accordance with the terms of this Financing Agreement and the Indenture.

Section 4.2. Use of TIF Revenues. Issuer covenants as follows:

(a) Upon receipt of Written Request of the Company pursuant to Section 4.4(b) of the Indenture, the Trustee shall distribute sums for Costs of Construction of the Projects as those costs are incurred until the Trustee has distributed the aggregate total amount of \_\_\_\_\_ Dollars (\$\_\_\_\_\_). All of the foregoing is for the benefit of the holders of the Series 2023 Bonds, to the end that industry and the economy may be diversified and job opportunities promoted and retained, and to secure the Series 2023 Bonds by pledging the TIF Revenues to the Trustee.

Section 4.3. Estoppel Certificate. The Issuer shall, upon reasonable request of the Company, provide the Company (or such person as the Company requests) with a certificate stating that an Event of Default by Company has not occurred hereunder as of the date of such certificate, provided that such state of facts are true.

(End of Article IV)

ARTICLE V.

EVENTS OF DEFAULT AND REMEDIES THEREFOR

Section 5.1. Events of Default. (a) The occurrence and continuance beyond all applicable cure periods of any of the following events shall constitute an "event of default" hereunder:

(i) failure of the Company to observe and perform any covenant, condition or provision hereof, including all warrants and representations, and to remedy such default within 60 days after notice thereof from the Trustee to the Company, unless the Issuer shall have consented thereto in writing; provided, however, that the Company shall have such additional time as is reasonably necessary to cure any non-monetary default that is not capable of being cured within such 60-day period so long as the Company is diligently pursuing such cure to completion; or

(ii) until such time as the Projects and Facility have been completed, the entry of a decree or order for relief by a court having jurisdiction in the premises in respect of the Company in an involuntary case under any applicable bankruptcy, insolvency or similar law now or hereafter in effect, or appointing a receiver, liquidator, assignee, custodian, trustee, sequestrator (or other similar official) of the Company or for any substantial part of its property, or ordering the windup or liquidation of its affairs; or the filing and pendency for ninety days without dismissal of a petition initiating an involuntary case under any other bankruptcy, insolvency or similar law;

(iii) until such time as the Projects and Facility have been completed, the commencement by the Company of any voluntary case under any applicable bankruptcy, insolvency or other similar law now or hereafter in effect, whether consent by it to an entry to an order for relief in an involuntary case and under any such law or to the appointment of or the taking possession by a receiver, liquidator, assignee, trustee, custodian, sequestrator (or other similar official) of the Company or of any substantial part of its property, or the making by the Company of any general assignment for the benefit of creditors, or the failure of the Company generally to pay its debts as such debts become due, or the taking of corporate action by the Company in furtherance of any of the foregoing; or

(iv) [failure of the Company to fulfill the requirements of Section 2.2(i)].

(b) Subject to the further provisions of this Article V, during the occurrence and continuance of any Event of Default hereunder, Issuer shall have the rights and remedies hereinafter set forth in addition to any other remedies herein or provided at law or in equity (provided that the Issuer shall have the right to assign and delegate all such remedies to the Trustee, who may exercise any or all such remedies):

(i) No Further Proceeds. The Issuer shall, upon an Event of Default, be entitled to direct the Trustee to cease honoring draw requests from the Construction Fund or from other proceeds of the Series 2023 Bonds and the Company shall not be entitled to further

draws from the Construction Fund or be entitled to other proceeds from the Series 2023 Bonds during the continuance of any such Event of Default[.]; or, if a default under Section 5.1(a)(iv), therein;]

(ii) [TIF Reduction.]

Section 5.2. Right to Bring Suit, Etc. The Issuer, with or without entry, personally or by attorney, may in its discretion, proceed to protect and enforce its rights by a suit or suits in equity or at law, whether for recovery of amounts due, for damages or for the specific performance of any covenant or agreement contained in this Financing Agreement or in aid of the execution of any power herein granted, or for the enforcement of any other appropriate legal or equitable remedy, as the Issuer shall deem most effectual to protect and enforce any of its rights or duties hereunder against Company; provided, however that all costs incurred by the Issuer under this Article V including its attorneys' fees and costs of collection, shall be paid by the Company to the Issuer within thirty (30) days' after receipt of written demand and receipt of all reasonably requested back-up information (e.g., receipts, and paid invoices). The Company acknowledges and agrees that the breach of some of its obligations cannot be cured by the payment of money and that equitable relief is an appropriate remedy.

Section 5.3. Remedies Cumulative. No remedy herein conferred upon or reserved to the Trustee is intended to be exclusive of any other remedy or remedies, and each and every such remedy shall be cumulative, and shall be in addition to every other remedy given hereunder or now or hereafter existing at law or in equity or by statute.

Section 5.4. Delay or Omission Not a Waiver. No delay or omission of the Trustee to exercise any right or power accruing upon any event of default shall impair any such right or power, or shall be construed to be a waiver of any such event of default or an acquiescence therein; and every power and remedy given by this Financing Agreement to the Trustee may be exercised from time to time and as often as may be deemed expedient by the Trustee.

Section 5.5. Remedies Subject to Provisions of Law. All rights, remedies and powers provided by this Article may be exercised only to the extent that the exercise thereof does not violate any applicable provision of law in the premises, and all the provisions of this Article are intended to be subject to all applicable mandatory provisions of law which may be controlling in the premises and to be limited to the extent necessary so that they will not render this Loan Agreement invalid or unenforceable under the provisions of any applicable law.

Section 5.6. Waiver of Events of Default. If after any event of default shall have occurred under this Financing Agreement and prior to the Trustee exercising any of the remedies provided in this Article, the Company shall have completely cured such default, such default may be waived at the discretion of the Issuer and, if so waived, shall be rescinded and annulled by the Trustee by written notice given to the Company.

(End of Article V)

ARTICLE VI.

IMMUNITY

Section 6.1. Immunity. No covenant or agreement contained in the Bonds, this Financing Agreement or the Indenture shall be deemed to be a covenant or agreement of any member of the Issuer or the Commission or of any officer or employee of the Issuer, the Commission or their legislative and fiscal bodies in his or her individual capacity, and neither the members of the Issuer, the Commission, nor any officer or employee of the Issuer executing the Bonds shall be liable personally on the Bonds or be subject to any personal liability or accountability by reason of the issuance of the Bonds.

(End of Article VI)

ARTICLE VII.

SUPPLEMENTS AND AMENDMENTS TO THIS FINANCING AGREEMENT

Section 7.1. Supplements and Amendments to this Financing Agreement. Subject to the provisions of Article 10 of the Indenture, the Company and the Issuer may, with the consent of the Trustee, from time to time enter into such supplements and amendments to this Financing Agreement as to them may seem necessary or desirable to effectuate the purposes or intent hereof.

(End of Article VII)

ARTICLE VIII.

DEFEASANCE

Section 8.1. Defeasance. If provision shall have been made for the satisfaction and discharge of the Indenture as provided therein, then and in that case this Financing Agreement shall thereupon cease, terminate and become void; and this Financing Agreement, and the covenants of the Company contained herein, shall be discharged and the Issuer and the Trustee in such case on demand of the Company and at its cost and expense, shall execute and deliver to the Company a proper instrument or proper instruments acknowledging the satisfaction and termination of this Financing Agreement.

(End of Article VIII)

ARTICLE IX.

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Section 9.1. Financing Agreement for Benefit of Parties Hereto. Nothing in this Financing Agreement, express or implied, is intended or shall be construed to confer upon, or to give to, any person other than the parties hereto, their successors and assigns the Trustee, any right, remedy or claim under or by reason of this Financing Agreement or any covenant, condition or stipulation hereof; and the covenants, stipulations and agreements in this Financing Agreement contained are and shall be for the sole and exclusive benefit of the parties hereto, their successors and assigns, the Trustee and the holder of the Series 2023 Bonds.

Section 9.2. Severability. If any one or more of the provisions contained in this Financing Agreement or in the Series 2023 Bonds shall be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, the validity, legality and enforceability of the remaining provisions contained herein and therein, shall not in any way be affected or impaired thereby.

Section 9.3. Limitation on Interest. No provisions of this Financing Agreement shall require the payment or permit the collection of interest in excess of the maximum permitted by law. If any excess of interest in such respect is herein provided for, or shall be adjudicated to be so provided for herein, neither the Company nor its successors or assigns shall be obligated to pay such interest in excess of the amount permitted by law, and the right to demand the payment of any such excess shall be and hereby is waived, and this provision shall control any provisions of this Financing Agreement inconsistent with this provision.

Section 9.4. Addresses for Notice and Demands. All notices, demands, certificates or other communications hereunder shall be sufficiently given and shall be deemed given when mailed by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, with proper address as indicated below. The Issuer, the Company and the Trustee may, by written notice given by each to the others, designate any address or addresses to which notices, demands, certificates or other communications to them shall be sent when required as contemplated by this Financing Agreement. Until otherwise provided by the respective parties, all notices, demands certificates and communications to each of them shall be addressed as follows:

Section 9.5. Successors and Assigns. At any time in this Financing Agreement any of the parties hereto is named or referred to, the successors and assigns of such party shall be deemed to be included and all the covenants, promises and agreements in this Financing Agreement contained by or on behalf of the Company, or by or on behalf of the Issuer, shall bind and inure to the benefit of the respective successors and assigns, whether so expressed or not.

Section 9.6. Counterparts. This Financing Agreement is being executed in any number of counterparts, each of which is an original and all of which are identical. Each counterpart of this Financing Agreement is to be deemed an original hereof and all counterparts collectively are to be deemed but one instrument.

Section 9.7. Governing Law. It is the intention of the parties hereto that this Financing Agreement and the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder and the rights and obligations of the parties thereunder, shall be governed by and construed and enforced in accordance with, the laws of the State.

## BOND PURCHASE AGREEMENT

BOND PURCHASE AGREEMENT, dated as of the \_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2023, by and among the City of Goshen, Indiana ("City" or "Issuer"), a municipal corporation and political subdivision organized and existing under the laws of the State of Indiana, AP Cycleworks LLC ("Company") and Legacy Communities, Inc. ("Purchaser").

### WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the City has duly authorized the issuance of its bonds designated "[Taxable] Economic Development Revenue Bonds, Series 2023 (Ariel Project)" ("Series 2023 Bonds") in the aggregate principal amount of \$\_\_\_\_\_ by the adoption of its Bond Ordinance on \_\_\_\_\_, 2023, a correct copy of which is incorporated herein by reference ("Bond Ordinance") and as described in the Trust Indenture, dated as of \_\_\_\_\_ 1, 2023 ("Indenture") between the City and \_\_\_\_\_, as trustee ("Trustee"); and

WHEREAS, the Purchaser has authorized the purchase of the Series 2023 Bonds;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE PURCHASER AND THE CITY AGREE:

Section 1. Purchase and Sale of the Series 2023 Bonds. (a) The Purchaser hereby agrees to purchase the Series 2023 Bonds and the City hereby agrees to use its best efforts to issue the Series 2023 Bonds and to sell the Series 2023 Bonds to the Purchaser at their face value (\$\_\_\_\_\_). The Series 2023 Bonds shall be dated their date of issuance and shall bear interest at the rate of \_\_\_% per annum, shall mature semiannually on January 1 and July 1 on the dates and in such amounts as set forth in Exhibit A attached hereto. The Series 2023 Bonds shall constitute a contract between the City and the Purchaser, as the owner of the Series 2023 Bonds.

(b) The City has taken or will take prior to closing all actions required by law to enable it to issue the Series 2023 Bonds.

(c) Prior to delivery of the Series 2023 Bonds by the City, the Purchaser will provide an investment letter to the effect that by acceptance of the Series 2023 Bonds the Purchaser will be deemed to have consented to all of the terms and provisions of the Bond Ordinance, the Indenture and the Financing Agreement (as defined in the Indenture) and will represent that:

- (i) It is a sophisticated investor and is familiar with securities such as the Series 2023 Bonds.
- (ii) It is familiar with the Issuer, the Goshen Redevelopment Commission ("Redevelopment Commission") and the Goshen Redevelopment District ("District"); it has received such information concerning the Issuer, the Redevelopment Commission, the District, the Series 2023 Bonds and the TIF Revenues as it deems to be necessary in connection with investment in the Series 2023 Bonds. It has received, read and had an opportunity to comment upon the Indenture, the Series 2023 Bonds, the TIF Pledge Resolution ("TIF Resolution") and the Financing Agreement. Prior to the purchase of the Series 2023 Bonds, it has been provided with the opportunity to ask questions of and receive answers

from the representatives of the Issuer and the Redevelopment Commission concerning the terms and conditions of the Series 2023 Bonds, the tax status of the Series 2023 Bonds, legal opinions and enforceability of remedies, the security therefor, and property tax reform, and to obtain any additional information needed in order to verify the accuracy of the information obtained to the extent that the Issuer possesses such information or can acquire it without unreasonable effort or expense. It is not relying on Ice Miller LLP, or Baker Tilly Municipal Advisors, LLC for information concerning the financial status of the Issuer or the Redevelopment Commission or the ability of the Issuer or the Redevelopment Commission to honor their financial obligations or other covenants under the Series 2023 Bonds, the Indenture or the Financing Agreement. It is understood that the projection of TIF Revenues (as defined in the TIF Resolution) prepared by Baker Tilly Municipal Advisors, LLC in connection with the issuance of the Series 2023 Bonds has been based on estimates of the investment in real property provided by the Company.

- (iii) It understands that the Issuer's collection of the TIF Revenues may be limited by operation of IC 6-1.1-20.6, which provides taxpayers with tax credits for property taxes attributable to different classes of property in an amount that exceeds certain percentages of the gross assessed value of that property. It further understands that neither the Issuer nor the Redevelopment Commission may levy a property tax or borrow money to make up any shortfall due to the application of this credit.
- (iv) It is acquiring the Series 2023 Bonds for its own account with no present intent to resell; and will not sell, convey, pledge or otherwise transfer the Series 2023 Bonds without prior compliance with applicable registration and disclosure requirements of state and federal securities laws.
- (v) It understands that the Series 2023 Bonds have not been registered under the 1933 Act and, unless so registered, may not be sold without registration under the 1933 Act or an exemption therefrom. It is aware that it may transfer or sell the Series 2023 Bonds only if the Trustee shall first have received: (i) a satisfactory opinion of counsel that the sale or transfer will not violate the 1933 Act, the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 and the Investment Company Act of 1940 and regulations issued pursuant to such Acts; or (ii) a no-action letter of the staff of the Securities and Exchange Commission that the staff will recommend that no action be taken with respect to such sale or transfer; or (iii) a certificate stating that it reasonably believes that the transferee is a "Qualified Institutional Buyer" within the meaning of Section (a) of Rule 144A ("Rule 144A") promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the 1933 Act and has informed the transferee of the transfer restrictions applicable to the Series 2023 Bonds and that the transferor may be relying upon Rule 144A with respect to the transfer of the Series 2023 Bonds.
- (vi) It has investigated the security for the Series 2023 Bonds, including the availability of TIF Revenues to its satisfaction, and it understands that the Series 2023 Bonds are payable solely from TIF Revenues.

- (vii) It recognizes that the opinions it has received express the professional judgment of the attorneys participating in the transaction as to the legal issues addressed herein. It also recognizes that by rendering such opinions, the attorneys do not become insurers or guarantors of that expression of professional judgment, of the transaction opined upon, or of the future performance of parties to such transaction. Nor does the rendering of the opinions guarantee the outcome of any legal dispute that may arise out of the transaction.
- (viii) It understands that the Issuer has no continuing disclosure obligations with regard to the Series 2023 Bonds.
- (ix) It understands that on March 11, 2020, the World Health Organization proclaimed the Coronavirus (COVID-19) to be a pandemic. In an effort to lessen the risk of transmission of COVID-19, the United States government, state governments, local governments and private industries have taken measures to limit social interactions in an effort to limit the spread of COVID-19, affecting business activities and impacting global, state and local commerce and financial markets. The emergence of COVID-19 and the spread thereof is an emerging and evolving issue. As the Issuer continues its efforts to contain and limit the spread COVID-19 disease, future tax and other revenue collections may deviate from anticipated and historical collections and may have an adverse impact on the financial position and operations of the Issuer and its ability to fund debt obligations, including the bonds in accordance with its terms. The Issuer is not able to predict and makes no representations as to the economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on the Issuer or its financial position.
- (x) [It understands that the interest on the Series 2023 Bonds is taxable for federal tax purposes.]

(d) Simultaneously with the delivery to, or at the direction of, the Purchaser of the Series 2023 Bonds, which Bonds shall be substantially in the form set forth in the Indenture, the City shall furnish to the Purchaser a transcript of proceedings and the opinion of Ice Miller LLP, bond counsel, addressed to the Trustee and the Purchaser as to, among other things, the validity of the Series 2023 Bonds and the tax-exempt status of interest on the Series 2023 Bonds.

Section 2. If any provision of this Purchase Agreement shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Purchase Agreement and this Purchase Agreement shall be construed and be in force as if such invalid or unenforceable provision had not been contained herein.

Section 3. This Purchase Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, any of which shall be regarded for all purposes as an original and all of which constitute but one and the same instrument. The Purchaser and the City each agree that they will execute any and all documents or other instruments and take such other actions as may be necessary to give effect to the terms of this Purchase Agreement.

Section 4. No waiver by either the Purchaser or the City of any term or condition of this Purchase Agreement shall be deemed or construed as a waiver of any other terms or conditions, nor shall a waiver of any breach be deemed to constitute a waiver of any subsequent breach, whether of the same or of a different section, subsection, paragraph, clause, phrase or other provision of this Purchase Agreement.

Section 5. This Purchase Agreement merges and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, and agreements among the Purchaser, the Company and the City relating to the subject matter hereof and constitutes the entire agreement among the Purchaser and the City in respect hereof.

This Interlocal Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is made and entered into effective this 16<sup>th</sup> day of August, 2023 by and between the County of Elkhart, Indiana acting by and through its governing body the Board of Commissioners of the County of Elkhart, Indiana for and on behalf of the Elkhart County Sheriff's Office, hereinafter referred to as "COUNTY;" the City of Elkhart, Indiana acting by and through its Mayor for and on behalf of the Elkhart Police Department, hereinafter referred to as "ELKHART;" and the City of Goshen, Indiana acting by and through Board of Public Works and Safety with the approval of the Goshen Common Council on behalf of the Goshen Police Department, hereinafter referred to as "GOSHEN;"

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS each governing body, in performing governmental functions or in paying for the performance of governmental functions hereunder, shall do so in a manner in compliance with applicable law from current funds legally available to that party;

WHEREAS COUNTY, ELKHART, and GOSHEN believe it to be in the best interests of the community to reallocate the JAG funds as provided herein;

WHEREAS each governing body finds that the terms, provisions, and performance of this MOU with respect to the 2023 Byrne Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program Award is in the best interests of the parties, that the undertaking will benefit the public, and that the allocation of funds fairly compensates the performing parties for the services or functions contemplated herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the terms and provisions contained herein, COUNTY, ELKHART, and GOSHEN agree as follows:

Section 1 The COUNTY agrees to be the fiscal agent for the joint funds and submit a joint application for the aggregate funds allocated.

Section 2 The COUNTY assumes the responsibility for the administration of the funds including distribution of the funds, monitoring the award, submitting reports including performance measurements and program assessment data, and providing ongoing assistance to ELKHART and GOSHEN.

Section 3 The JAG funds must be used to supplement existing funds for program activities and cannot replace, or supplant, nonfederal funds that have been appropriated for the same purpose. JAG funds cannot be used, directly or indirectly, for security enhancements or equipment to non-governmental entities not engaged in criminal justice or public safety.

Section 4 The COUNTY will establish a non-interest-bearing trust fund in which to deposit the JAG funds and will be responsible for assuring that all award monies are expended within the 4-year grant period.

Section 5 All parties agree that GOSHEN shall utilize their full individual allocation amount – thirty-three thousand nine hundred sixty dollars (\$33,960) of the aggregate JAG funds allocated herein for officer and community safety in activities of prevention and crime control. GOSHEN shall timely submit one or more appropriately completed and executed claim forms to COUNTY for processing of a distribution or distributions of the aggregate JAG funds allocated herein for them.

Section 6 All parties agree that ELKHART has declined participation in the Fiscal Year 2023 JAG grant program. As such they acknowledge and understand they will receive no funding (\$0) for the four-year term. They will have no reporting obligations for this year. The declination of participation applies to the FY23 JAG program and ELKHART will have every opportunity to participate in future grant programs. Declination notice was received and acknowledged August 14, 2023.

Section 7 All parties agree that the COUNTY shall utilize their full individual allocation amount of – thirty-three thousand nine hundred sixty dollars (\$33,960) of the aggregate JAG funds allocated herein for officer and community safety in activities of prevention and crime control.

Section 8 GOSHEN agrees to provide timely and appropriate data to assist the COUNTY in monitoring the award and submitting reports.

Section 9 GOSHEN agrees to maintain open communications with the COUNTY in regard to the expenditure of JAG funds.

Section 10 GOSHEN agrees that any program adjustments must be approved by the Bureau of Justice Assistance Program compliance personnel through the COUNTY and that they will provide the COUNTY a minimum of thirty (30) days notice of program changes allowing the COUNTY to obtain approval of the program adjustment.

Section 11 Each party to this MOU will be responsible for its own actions in providing services or in receiving funding herein and shall not be responsible for any civil liability that may arise from the furnishing of the services or the receipt of funding by the other parties.

Section 12 By entering into this MOU, the parties do not intend to create any obligations, express or implied, other than those set out herein. Further this MOU shall not create any rights in any party not a signatory hereto.

Section 13 All parties understand that all activities related to the JAG Program are bound by and compliance must be made with Title II – Improving the Department of Justices Grant Programs; Subtitle A - Assisting Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice Agencies Sec. 500 - 508 and the Justice Assistance Grant Application submitted to the Bureau of Justice Assistance, in addition to requirements that may be later added. COUNTY, ELKHART, and GOSHEN each respectfully agree to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the other parties hereto from any claims, demands, damages, liabilities, fines and penalties arising from each party's own respective violation of or failure to comply with these legal requirements.

Section 14 This MOU shall be binding upon the parties hereto and their respective successors. This MOU may be executed in multiple counterparts and separate signature pages with the multiple counterparts and separate signature pages constituting but one single, complete, and entire document.

**INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT**  
**Between the City of Goshen and County of Elkhart**  
**For East College Avenue/CR 36 Reconstruction from Fairgrounds to CR 31**

This Agreement is made and entered into this \_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_, 2023, by and between the City of Goshen, Indiana (“City”) by and through the Goshen Board of Public Works and Safety, and with the approval of the Goshen Common Council, and the County of Elkhart, Indiana (“County”) by and through the Board of Commissioners of the County of Elkhart, Indiana, and with the approval of the Elkhart County Council (both parties are collectively referred to as “Parties”).

Witnesseth:

WHEREAS, a substantial industrial construction project is underway along College Avenue, on the east side of the City of Goshen, that requires improvements to public roadways in the area of the construction project;

WHEREAS, City has contracted with Niblock Excavating, Inc. for the industrial construction project;

WHEREAS, the City plans to undertake a reconstruction and widening of College Avenue in 2027;

WHEREAS, East College Avenue and County Road 36 between the back entrance to the Elkhart County 4-H Fairgrounds and County Road 31 is in poor repair and is in need of repair prior to the City’s 2027 reconstruction and widening;

WHEREAS, the County agrees to provide part of the funding for the road repair needed for County Road 36 to County Road 31 as herein provided;

WHEREAS, the City and County enter into this Agreement to identify the duties and responsibilities of the City and County to improve infrastructure near the industrial construction project along College Avenue;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and promises and commitments herein contained, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Project. Project includes the full depth reclamation of the existing asphalt and subgrade and replacement of hot mix asphalt base and surface for Four Thousand Three Hundred (4,300) linear feet along East College Avenue and County Road 36, as indicated on the map attached as Exhibit A. Project will be added to the existing scope of work being completed by Niblock Excavating, Inc. for the industrial construction project along East College Avenue.
2. Lead Agency. City will serve as the Lead Agency for the Project, including, but not limited to, the following duties:
  - a. Awarding the Project in compliance with governmental requirements applicable to the City and County.
  - b. Obtaining any permits or approvals required to construct the Project.
  - c. Providing or contracting for engineering review and construction inspection services for the Project to the extent that such are not the responsibility of the contractor.
  - d. Maintaining the documents, contractors, notes, and other records connected with the Project.
  - e. Providing the County with a financial summary of all funds needed for the Project, all funds received for the Project, and all funds spent on the Project, including the reconciliation of the funding provided by the City and County.
  - f. Paying all administrative costs and expenses associated with serving as the Lead Agency for the Project.
3. Costs. Niblock Excavating, Inc. has provided Change Order No.1, attached to this Agreement as Exhibit B, summarizing the costs of repair work for the Project,

totaling Two Hundred Sixty Thousand Seven Hundred Nine Dollars (\$260,709.00).

4. County Participation. City will serve as the Lead Agency for the Project. City and County acknowledge that City will provide the administrative and oversight services required for the Project. County participation shall include, but not be limited to, the following:
  - a. County will pay a proportional share representing the One Thousand Three (1,300) linear feet of roadway to be repaired located outside the corporate boundaries of the City of Goshen, Indiana. This amount is equal to Seventy-Eight Thousand Eight Hundred Nineteen Dollars (\$78,819.00) [ $1300/4300 \times \$260,709.00$ ].
  - b. County will pay its proportional share to City no later than March 31, 2024.
5. Approvals. This Agreement is subject to the approval of the Goshen Board of Public Works and Safety and the Goshen Common Council for City, and the Board of Commissioners of the County of Elkhart, Indiana and Elkhart County Council for County.
6. Duration. This Agreement shall be effective upon its execution and continue until the Project is complete and County has paid its proportional share per Paragraph No. 4.
7. Supplemental Documents. The Parties agree to execute any and all supplementary documents and to take any and all supplementary steps as are reasonable and appropriate to accomplish the purposes and provisions of this Agreement.
8. Limitations of Liability. City acknowledges that County shall not be liable to City for completion of or the failure to complete any activities that are an obligations of City to perform pursuant to this Agreement, and City agrees to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless County and its agents, officers, and employees from all claims and suits of any nature whatsoever arising from City's performance of this Agreement, from all judgments therefore, and all expenses in defending or appealing any such claims or judgments, including without limitation court costs, attorney's fees, and other expenses.
9. Non-Discrimination. Pursuant to Indiana Code § 22-9-1-10, neither City, nor any of its contractors or subcontractors shall discriminate against any employee or

applicant for employment, to be employed in the performance of any work under this Agreement with respect to hire, tenure, terms or conditions or privileges of employment, or any matter directly or indirectly related to employment because of race, color, religion, sex, disability, national origin, ancestry or veteran status. Breach of this covenant may be regarded as a material breach of this Agreement.

10. Anti-Nepotism. City is aware of the provisions under Indiana Code § 36-1-21 with respect to anti-nepotism in contractual relationships with governmental entities, and shall comply with such statute.
11. Investment Activity. Pursuant to Indiana Code § 5-22-16.5, City certifies that it is not engaged in investment activities in Iran.
12. E-Verify Program. Pursuant to Indiana Code § 22-5-1.7-11, City agrees to and shall enroll in and verify the work eligibility status of all newly hired employees of City after the date of the Agreement through the E-Verify Program as defined in Indiana Code § 22-5-1.7-3. City further represents and certifies subject to the pains and penalties for perjury that it does not knowingly employ an unauthorized alien.
13. Amendment. This Agreement and any exhibits attached hereto, may be amended only by the mutual written consent of the parties, by the adoption of a resolution approving said amendment as provided by law, and by the execution of said amendment by the parties.
14. No Other Agreement. Except as otherwise expressly provided herein, this Agreement supersedes all prior agreements, negotiations, and discussions relative to the subject matter hereof and is a full integration of the agreement of the parties.
15. Severability. If any provision, covenant, agreement, or portion of this Agreement or its application to any person, entity or property is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the application or validity of any other provisions, covenants, agreements, or portions of this Agreement, and to that end, any provisions, covenants, agreements, or portions of this Agreement are declared to be severable.
16. Indiana Law. Any notices required or permitted under this Agreement shall be given to the parties at their respective mailing addresses provided below by deposit in the United States mail, certified mail, return receipt requested, with proper postage affixed thereto, and which notices shall be effective three (3) days after date of mailing:



**TERMINATION OF THE  
GOSHEN DAM POND INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT**

This Termination of the Goshen Dam Pond Interlocal Agreement ("Termination") is entered into effective upon the last to sign this Termination, by and between City of Goshen, an Indiana municipal corporation ("City"), the County of Elkhart, a political subdivision of the State of Indiana ("County"), and the Goshen Dam Pond Economic Improvement District, an economic improvement district organized under the laws of the State of Indiana ("EID"). The City, the County, and the EID are collectively referred to herein as the "Parties."

**RECITALS**

A. The County of Elkhart ("County"), Goshen Dam Pond Economic Improvement District ("EID") and the City of Goshen ("City") entered into an Interlocal Agreement dated December 28, 2015 ("Interlocal Agreement").

B. On September 14, 2020, the EID approved termination of the Interlocal Agreement so long as the assessment funds received by the EID in or after calendar year 2020 are not considered as remaining funds held by the EID in their economic improvement funds for distribution under Section 8.1 of the Interlocal Agreement.

C. The Elkhart County Commissioners adopted Resolution CO 2020-29 Supporting Termination of the Goshen Dam Pond Interlocal Agreement on October 26, 2020, agreeing to terminate the Interlocal Agreement by executing this Termination and distribute any remaining funds as provided in Section VIII, paragraph 8.1 of the Interlocal Agreement, with the assessment fees received by the EID in 2020 and thereafter not being included in the funds available for distribution.

D. The Common Council for the City of Goshen passed and adopted Council Resolution 2020-24 Supporting Termination of the Goshen Dam Pond Interlocal Agreement on November 20, 2020, agreeing to terminate the Interlocal Agreement by executing this Termination and distribute any remaining funds as provided in Section VIII, paragraph 8.1 of the Interlocal Agreement, with the assessment fees received by the EID in 2020 and thereafter not being included in the funds available for distribution.

Now, therefore, it is agreed by the Parties as follows:

## AGREEMENT

**TERMINATION OF THE  
GOSHEN DAM POND INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT**

This Termination of the Goshen Dam Pond Interlocal Agreement (“Termination”) is entered into effective upon the last to sign this Termination, by and between City of Goshen, an Indiana municipal corporation (“City”), the County of Elkhart, a political subdivision of the State of Indiana (“County”), and the Goshen Dam Pond Economic Improvement District, an economic improvement district organized under the laws of the State of Indiana (“EID”). **RECITALS**

A. The County of Elkhart (“County”), Goshen Dam Pond Economic Improvement District (“EID”) and the City of Goshen (“City”) entered into an Interlocal Agreement dated December 28, 2015 (“Interlocal Agreement”).

B. On September 14, 2020, the EID approved termination of the Interlocal Agreement so long as the assessment funds received by the EID in or after calendar year 2020 are not considered as remaining funds held by the EID in their economic improvement funds for distribution under Section 8.1 of the Interlocal Agreement.

C. The Elkhart County Commissioners adopted Resolution CO 2020-29 Supporting Termination of the Goshen Dam Pond Interlocal Agreement on October 26, 2020, agreeing to terminate the Interlocal Agreement by executing this Termination and distribute any remaining funds as provided in Section VIII, paragraph 8.1 of the Interlocal Agreement, with the assessment fees received by the EID in 2020 and thereafter not being included in the funds available for distribution.

D. The Common Council for the City of Goshen passed and adopted Council Resolution 2020-24 Supporting Termination of the Goshen Dam Pond Interlocal Agreement on November 20, 2020, agreeing to terminate the Interlocal Agreement by executing this Termination and distribute any remaining funds as provided in Section VIII, paragraph 8.1 of the Interlocal Agreement, with the assessment fees received by the EID in 2020 and thereafter not being included in the funds available for distribution.

Now, therefore, it is agreed by the Parties as follows:
