From GCS Bylaw 0160:

Public Participation at Board Meetings

The School Board recognizes the value of public comment on educational issues and the importance of allowing members of the public to express themselves on Corporation matters.

Any person or group wishing to place an item on the agenda shall register their intent with the Superintendent no later than ten (10) days prior to the meeting and include:

- A. name and address of the participant;
- B. group affiliation, if and when appropriate;
- C. topic to be addressed.

Such requests shall be approved by the Superintendent and the Board President.

To permit fair and orderly public expression, the Board may provide a period for public participation at every regular meeting of the Board and publish procedures to govern such participation in Board meetings.

The presiding officer of each Board meeting at which public participation is permitted shall administer the procedures of the Board for its conduct.

The presiding officer shall be guided by the following rules:

- A. Public participation shall be permitted at the discretion of the presiding officer.
- B. Participants must be recognized by the presiding officer and will be requested to preface their comments by an announcement of their name and address.
- C. Each statement made by a participant may be limited by the presiding officer.
- D. All statements shall be directed to the presiding officer; no person may address or question Board members individually.
- E. The presiding officer may:
- 1. prohibit public comments which are frivolous repetitive, or harassing;
- 2. interrupt, warn, or terminate a person's statement when the statement is too lengthy, personally directed, abusive, obscene, or irrelevant;
- 3. request any individual to leave the meeting when that person behaves in a manner that is disruptive of the orderly conduct of the meeting;

4. request the assistance of law enforcement officers in the removal of a disorderly person when that person's conduct interferes with the orderly progress of the meeting;

- 5. call for a recess or an adjournment to another time when the lack of public decorum so interferes with the orderly conduct of the meeting as to warrant such action;
- 6. waive these rules.
- F. Tape or video recordings are permitted. The person operating the recorder should contact the Superintendent prior to the Board meeting to review possible placement of the equipment, and agrees to abide by the following conditions:
- 1. No obstructions are created between the Board and the audience.
- 2. No interviews are conducted during the Board meeting.
- 3. No commentary is made that would distract either the Board or members of the audience.


Goshen Enrollment 2019 - 2022




Elkhart County Schools Enrollment 2019 - 2022








Exit Interview Summary

Schools. Out of those 245, schools were able to make contact with 146 students Since the beginning of school until January 20, there were 245 students leave Goshen Community

- and various personal issues as their reason for leaving and going to a different state 24% of those contacted left the state. Most of the families stated change of custody, job change,
- 33% of students that moved within Elkhart County stated housing and change of custody as their main reasons. Of those that stayed within the county, 47% enrolled in Elkhart Schools
- in custody and financial reasons 16% of our students moved out of Elkhart County. The main reasons were housing related, change






Construction Costs and Funding



- Projects bid in the Fall of '21 and Spring '22 and averaged 15-20% above the expected project cost.
- INDOT has recently had to rebid numerous projects because all of the bids came in too high to allow acceptance.
- Will likely affect the scope and number of projects able to be completed in the coming months.

- Working to obtain funding through ECF "Connect in Elkhart County" or DOT grant.



Flood Resilience Plan





TRENDS IN HOUSEHOLD TRASH







